ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, Office of the State Public Defender, Department of Transportation, Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety - Director's Office and Highway Patrol each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
