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### AN ACT

To repeal section 170.011, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to transfer student curriculum.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 170.011, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 170.011, to read as follows:

170.011. 1. Regular courses of instruction in the Constitution of the United States and of the state of Missouri and in American history and institutions shall be given in all public and private schools in the state of Missouri, except privately operated trade schools, and shall begin not later than the seventh grade and continue in high school to an extent determined by the state commissioner of education, and shall continue in college and university courses to an extent determined by the state commissioner of higher education. In the 1990-91 school year and each year thereafter, local school districts maintaining high schools shall comply with the provisions of this section by offering in grade nine, ten, eleven, or twelve a course of instruction in the institutions, branches and functions of the government of the state of Missouri, including local governments, and of the government of the United States, and in the electoral process. A local school district maintaining such a high school shall require that prior to the completion of the twelfth grade each pupil, who receives a high school diploma or certificate of graduation on or after January 1, 1994, shall satisfactorily complete such a course of study. Such course shall be of at least one semester in length and may be two semesters in length. The department of

15 elementary and secondary education may provide assistance in developing such a course if the  
16 district requests assistance. **Upon individual school district election, a student who transfers**  
17 **from outside the state to a Missouri high school may not be required to complete another**  
18 **course as a condition precedent to graduation from the high school if the student can**  
19 **furnish documentation deemed acceptable by the school district of the student's successful**  
20 **completion in any year from the ninth through the twelfth grade of a course that covers**  
21 **state and federal government.**

22         2. American history courses at the elementary and secondary levels shall include in their  
23 proper time-line sequence specific referrals to the details and events of the racial equality  
24 movement that have caused major changes in United States and Missouri laws and attitudes.

25         3. No pupil shall receive a certificate of graduation from any public or private school  
26 other than private trade schools unless he has satisfactorily passed an examination on the  
27 provisions and principles of the Constitution of the United States and of the state of Missouri,  
28 and in American history and American institutions. **Upon individual school district election,**  
29 **a student who transfers from outside the state to a Missouri high school may not be**  
30 **required to pass an examination on the provisions and principles of the Constitution of the**  
31 **state of Missouri as a condition precedent to graduation from the high school if the student**  
32 **can furnish documentation deemed acceptable by the school district of the student's**  
33 **successful completion in any year from the ninth through the twelfth grade of a course that**  
34 **covers state and federal government.** A student of a college or university, who, after having  
35 completed a course of instruction prescribed in this section and successfully passed an  
36 examination on the United States Constitution, and in American history and American  
37 institutions required hereby, transfers to another college or university, is not required to complete  
38 another such course or pass another such examination as a condition precedent to his graduation  
39 from the college or university.

40         4. In the 1990-91 school year and each year thereafter, each school district maintaining  
41 a high school may annually nominate to the state board of education a student who has  
42 demonstrated knowledge of the principles of government and citizenship through academic  
43 achievement, participation in extracurricular activities, and service to the community. Annually,  
44 the state board of education shall select fifteen students from those nominated by the local school  
45 districts and shall recognize and award them for their academic achievement, participation and  
46 service.

47         5. [The state commissioner of education and the state commissioner of higher education  
48 shall make arrangements for carrying out the provisions of this section and prescribe a list of  
49 suitable texts adapted to the needs of the school grades and college courses, respectively.

50           6. The willful neglect of any superintendent, principal or teacher to observe and carry  
51 out the requirements of this section is sufficient cause for termination of his contract.

52           7.] The provisions of this section shall not apply to students from foreign countries who  
53 are enrolled in public or private high schools in Missouri, if such students are foreign exchange  
54 students sponsored by a national organization recognized by the department of elementary and  
55 secondary education.

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
