AN ACT

To repeal sections 160.545 and 170.011, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to elementary and secondary education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 160.545 and 170.011, RSMo, are repealed and four

- 2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 160.545, 170.011,
- 3 170.400, and 192.631, to read as follows:
 - 160.545. 1. There is hereby established within the department of
- 2 elementary and secondary education the "A+ Schools Program" to be administered
- 3 by the commissioner of education. The program shall consist of grant awards
- 4 made to public secondary schools that demonstrate a commitment to ensure that:
- 5 (1) All students be graduated from school;
- 6 (2) All students complete a selection of high school studies that is
- 7 challenging and for which there are identified learning expectations; and
- 8 (3) All students proceed from high school graduation to a college or
- 9 postsecondary vocational or technical school or high-wage job with work place
- 10 skill development opportunities.
- 11 2. The state board of education shall promulgate rules and regulations for
- 12 the approval of grants made under the program to schools that:
- 13 (1) Establish measurable districtwide performance standards for the goals
- 14 of the program outlined in subsection 1 of this section; and
- 15 (2) Specify the knowledge, skills and competencies, in measurable terms,
- 16 that students must demonstrate to successfully complete any individual course

- offered by the school, and any course of studies which will qualify a student for graduation from the school; and
- 19 (3) Do not offer a general track of courses that, upon completion, can lead 20 to a high school diploma; and
- 21 (4) Require rigorous coursework with standards of competency in basic 22 academic subjects for students pursuing vocational and technical education as 23 prescribed by rule and regulation of the state board of education; and
- 24(5) Have a partnership plan developed in cooperation and with the advice 25of local business persons, labor leaders, parents, and representatives of college and postsecondary vocational and technical school representatives, with the plan 2627 then approved by the local board of education. The plan shall specify a mechanism to receive information on an annual basis from those who developed 28 the plan in addition to senior citizens, community leaders, and teachers to update 2930 the plan in order to best meet the goals of the program as provided in subsection 1 of this section. Further, the plan shall detail the procedures used in the school 31 to identify students that may drop out of school and the intervention services to 32 be used to meet the needs of such students. The plan shall outline counseling 33 and mentoring services provided to students who will enter the work force upon 34 graduation from high school, address apprenticeship and intern programs, and 35 36 shall contain procedures for the recruitment of volunteers from the community of the school to serve in schools receiving program grants. 37
 - 3. A school district may participate in the program irrespective of its accreditation classification by the state board of education, provided it meets all other requirements.
 - 4. By rule and regulation, the state board of education may determine a local school district variable fund match requirement in order for a school or schools in the district to receive a grant under the program. However, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the program unless the district designates a salaried employee to serve as the program coordinator, with the district assuming a minimum of one-half the cost of the salary and other benefits provided to the coordinator. Further, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the program unless the district makes available facilities and services for adult literacy training as specified by rule of the state board of education.
- 51 [4.] 5. For any school that meets the requirements for the approval of the grants authorized by this section and specified in subsection 2 of this section for

three successive school years, by August first following the third such school year, 53 54 the commissioner of education shall present a plan to the superintendent of the school district in which such school is located for the waiver of rules and 55 56 regulations to promote flexibility in the operations of the school and to enhance and encourage efficiency in the delivery of instructional services in the 57 school. The provisions of other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the plan 58 59 presented to the superintendent shall provide a summary waiver, with no 60 conditions, for the pupil testing requirements pursuant to section 160.257 in the 61 school. Further, the provisions of other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the plan shall detail a means for the waiver of requirements otherwise imposed on 62 the school related to the authority of the state board of education to classify 63 school districts pursuant to subdivision (9) of section 161.092, RSMo, and such 64 other rules and regulations as determined by the commissioner of education, 65 except such waivers shall be confined to the school and not other schools in the 66 school district unless such other schools meet the requirements of this 67 subsection. However, any waiver provided to any school as outlined in this 68 69 subsection shall be void on June thirtieth of any school year in which the school fails to meet the requirements for the approval of the grants authorized by this 70 section as specified in subsection 2 of this section. 71

- [5.] 6. For any school year, grants authorized by subsections 1 to 3 of this section shall be funded with the amount appropriated for this program, less those funds necessary to reimburse eligible students pursuant to subsection 6 of this section.
- [6.] 7. The commissioner of education shall, by rule and regulation of the state board of education and with the advice of the coordinating board for higher education, establish a procedure for the reimbursement of the cost of tuition, books and fees to any public community college or vocational or technical school for any student:
- (1) Who has attended a public high school in the state for at least three 82 years immediately prior to graduation that meets the requirements of subsection 2 of this section, except that students who are active duty military dependents 83 who, in the school year immediately preceding graduation, meet all other requirements of this subsection and are attending a school that meets the 86 requirements of subsection 2 of this section shall be exempt from the three-year attendance requirement of this subdivision; and
 - (2) Who has made a good faith effort to first secure all available federal

89 sources of funding that could be applied to the reimbursement described in this 90 subsection; and

- 91 (3) Who has earned a minimal grade average while in high school as 92 determined by rule of the state board of education, and other requirements for the 93 reimbursement authorized by this subsection as determined by rule and 94 regulation of said board.
- 95 [7.] 8. The commissioner of education shall develop a procedure for 96 evaluating the effectiveness of the program described in this section. Such 97 evaluation shall be conducted annually with the results of the evaluation 98 provided to the governor, speaker of the house, and president pro tempore of the 99 senate.

170.011. 1. Regular courses of instruction in the Constitution of the United States and of the state of Missouri and in American history and institutions shall be given in all public and private schools in the state of Missouri, except privately operated trade schools, and shall begin not later than the seventh grade and continue in high school to an extent determined by the state commissioner of education, and shall continue in college and university courses to an extent determined by the state commissioner of higher education. In the 1990-91 school year and each year thereafter, local school districts maintaining high schools shall comply with the provisions of this section by 10 offering in grade nine, ten, eleven, or twelve a course of instruction in the institutions, branches and functions of the government of the state of Missouri, 11 12including local governments, and of the government of the United States, and in the electoral process. A local school district maintaining such a high school shall require that prior to the completion of the twelfth grade each pupil, who receives 14 a high school diploma or certificate of graduation on or after January 1, 1994, 15shall satisfactorily complete such a course of study. Such course shall be of at 16 least one semester in length and may be two semesters in length. The department of elementary and secondary education may provide assistance in 18 19 developing such a course if the district requests assistance. A school district may elect to waive the requirements of this subsection for any student 20who transfers from outside the state to a Missouri high school if the 2122student can furnish documentation deemed acceptable by the school 23district of the student's successful completion in any year from the 24ninth through the twelfth grade of a course of instruction in the institutions, branches, and functions of state government, including

local governments, and of the government of the United States, and in 26 27 the electoral process.

- 2. American history courses at the elementary and secondary levels shall include in their proper time-line sequence specific referrals to the details and events of the racial equality movement that have caused major changes in United States and Missouri laws and attitudes.
- 3. No pupil shall receive a certificate of graduation from any public or private school other than private trade schools unless he has satisfactorily passed 33 an examination on the provisions and principles of the Constitution of the United States and of the state of Missouri, and in American history and American 36 institutions. A school district may elect to waive the requirements of this subsection for any student who transfers from outside the state to 37 38 a Missouri high school if the student can furnish documentation deemed acceptable by the school district of the student's successful 39 completion in any year from the ninth through the twelfth grade of a 40 course of instruction in the institutions, branches, and functions of state government, including local governments, and of the government 42of the United States, and in the electoral process. A student of a college 43 or university, who, after having completed a course of instruction prescribed in 44 this section and successfully passed an examination on the United States Constitution, and in American history and American institutions required hereby, transfers to another college or university, is not required to complete another such course or pass another such examination as a condition precedent to his 48 graduation from the college or university.
 - 4. In the 1990-91 school year and each year thereafter, each school district maintaining a high school may annually nominate to the state board of education a student who has demonstrated knowledge of the principles of government and citizenship through academic achievement, participation in extracurricular activities, and service to the community. Annually, the state board of education shall select fifteen students from those nominated by the local school districts and shall recognize and award them for their academic achievement, participation and service.
 - 5. [The state commissioner of education and the state commissioner of higher education shall make arrangements for carrying out the provisions of this section and prescribe a list of suitable texts adapted to the needs of the school grades and college courses, respectively.

- 6. The willful neglect of any superintendent, principal or teacher to observe and carry out the requirements of this section is sufficient cause for termination of his contract.
- 7.] The provisions of this section shall not apply to students from foreign countries who are enrolled in public or private high schools in Missouri, if such students are foreign exchange students sponsored by a national organization recognized by the department of elementary and secondary education.

170.400. Any and all equipment and educational materials

necessary for successful participation in supplemental educational
services programming shall not be deemed an incentive for the
purposes of compliance with department of elementary and secondary
education rules and regulations for supplemental educational services
provider certification. The department of elementary and secondary
education shall not prohibit providers of supplemental and educational
services from allowing students to retain equipment used by them upon
successful completion of supplemental and educational services.

192.631. 1. Subject to appropriations, by July 1, 2009, the department of health and senior services shall establish a school-based influenza vaccination pilot program. Participation in the program shall be voluntary on the part of the school district and shall be administered with the consent of the student's parents or legal guardian. When creating the program, the department shall also take into account:

- 8 (1) The costs and benefits of establishing a school-based 9 influenza vaccination pilot program;
- 10 (2) The barriers to implementing the proposed pilot program; 11 and
- 12 (3) The fiscal impact to the state of such program.
- 13 2. The department shall work to increase influenza vaccination awareness and participation among parents of children aged six 14months to five years in child care facilities. The official website of the department shall have information on the benefits of annual 16 vaccination against influenza for children and its programs offered for 17the children. The department shall cooperate with the department of 18 social services and department of elementary and secondary education 19 20in order to distribute the information to the parents and child care facilities effectively in August or September in every year.

- 223. The department shall promulgate rules for the implementation 23of the pilot program created under this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created 2425under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 26 27 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested 2829 with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to 30 delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 31 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2008, shall 32 be invalid and void. 33
- 34 4. Pursuant to section 23.253, RSMo, of the Missouri Sunset Act:
- 35 (1) Any new program authorized under this section shall 36 automatically sunset six years after the effective date of this section 37 unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly; and
- 38 (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized 39 under this section shall automatically sunset twelve years after the 40 effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
- 41 (3) This section shall terminate on September first of the 42 calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which a 43 program authorized under this section is sunset.
