AN ACT

To repeal section 170.132, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to obtaining print instructional material in specialized formats.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 170.132, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 170.132, to read as follows:

170.132. [All public elementary, secondary and postsecondary schools shall preferentially procure educational materials, including textbooks and collateral materials, from 2 vendors who make the materials available in either Braille format or electronic format which is 3 computer-readable in a form approved by the department of elementary and secondary education, 4 5 or both, at no greater cost than for regular materials.]

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1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

7 (1) "Electronic files", electronic files that conform to the national instructional 8 materials standard established by the United States Secretary of Education under the 9 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, sections 612(a)(23)(A) and 674(e)(4), or other standard approved by the department of elementary and secondary education; 10

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- (2) "Missouri assistive technology council" or "council", the body which directs the Missouri assistive technology program under sections 191.850 to 191.867, RSMo; 12
- 13 (3) "Print instructional materials", printed textbooks and related printed core 14 materials that are written and published primarily for use in elementary, secondary, and

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post-secondary instruction and are required by the purchasing elementary, secondary, or

post-secondary school as a principal instructional material for use by students in the

classroom to meet the curriculum requirements for the intended course. Related core

materials must be directly related to the textbook and do not include materials that are not

19 written and published primarily for use by students in the classroom, such as newspapers, reference works, and trade books, or other ancillary or supplemental materials; 20 21 (4) "Schools", elementary, secondary, or post-secondary schools in Missouri; (5) "Specialized formats", braille, large print, digital audio, and electronic text 22 23 when used by students with disabilities who are unable to use standard print; 24 (6) "Students with print disabilities", students who are unable to use standard 25 print materials due to documented visual, physical, cognitive, or other disability. 26 2. Beginning January 1, 2009, every publisher or vendor of print instructional materials: 27 28 (1) Shall make electronic files of the materials available at no cost to schools purchasing such materials along with the right to transcribe, reproduce, modify, and 29 30 distribute the material in specialized formats solely for use by students with print 31 disabilities; 32 (2) Shall deliver the electronic files to the purchasing school within thirty days of 33 a written request by the school; and 34 (3) May request the school certify that the instructional material has been purchased for use by a student with a print disability attending the school in connection 35 with a course or class in which he or she is enrolled. 36 37 3. If a publisher or vendor fails to comply with the requirements of this section, the 38 publisher or vendor shall be liable to the school that purchased the print instructional materials in the amount of three times the cost to the purchasing school to obtain materials 39 40 in the needed specialized formats. 41 4. In order to ensure the effective implementation of subsection 3 of this section, a liability claim may be made on behalf of the purchasing school by either the individual 42 43 purchaser; a school, school district, college, or university that employs the individual 44 purchaser; the Missouri department of elementary and secondary education; the Missouri 45 attorney general; or the Missouri department of higher education. 46 5. The Missouri assistive technology council shall establish a system to track and 47 catalog access to and production of accessible format instructional materials by schools to 48 enable reutilization of such materials to the maximum extent possible. 1
