AN ACT

To repeal section 302.080, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to driver's license requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.080, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 302.080, to read as follows:

302.080. The following persons are exempt from license hereunder:

(1) Any person while operating any farm tractor or implement of husbandry temporarily operated or moved on a highway;

(2) A nonresident who is at least sixteen years of age and who has in his immediate possession a valid license issued to him in his home state or country;

(3) A nonresident who is at least eighteen years of age and who has in his immediate possession a valid license issued to him in his home state or country which allows such person to operate a motor vehicle in the transportation of persons or property as classified in section 302.015, **as long as the nonresident has entered and is in this country legally;**

(4) Convicted offenders of the department of corrections who have not been convicted of a motor vehicle felony as follows--driving while intoxicated, failing to stop after an accident and disclosing his or her identity, or driving a motor vehicle without the owner's consent--may
