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## AN ACT

To repeal section 96.160, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to municipal health facilities.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 96.160, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu  
2 thereof, to be known as section 96.160, to read as follows:

96.160. 1. Each facility established or operated and maintained under the provisions of  
2 sections 96.150 to 96.228 shall be governed by a board of trustees who shall serve without  
3 compensation. Each such board of trustees shall consist of five trustees, who shall be citizens  
4 of the city, unless the council shall provide by ordinance for a larger board of not more than  
5 fifteen trustees. Trustees shall be appointed by the mayor with the approval of the council and  
6 shall be chosen with reference to their fitness for such position; provided no member of the city

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

7 council and no member of the immediate family of a member of the city council shall be a  
8 member of the board.

9         2. An ordinance providing for a larger board of trustees [shall require that three-fifths  
10 of such trustees shall be citizens of the city and] may provide that **some or all of** the [remaining]  
11 trustees need not be citizens of the city, but shall be citizens of the state of Missouri.

12         3. Any city establishing or maintaining and operating more than one health care facility  
13 may provide by ordinance that one board of trustees shall manage and operate two or more health  
14 care facilities.

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
