AN ACT

To repeal section 173.250, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the higher education academic scholarship program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Section 173.250, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 173.250, to read as follows:
- 173.250. 1. As used in this section, unless the context requires otherwise, the 2 following terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Academic scholarship", an amount of money paid by the state of Missouri to 4 a qualified college or university student who has demonstrated superior academic 5 achievement under the provisions of this section;
- 6 (2) "Academic year", the period from August first of any year through July thirty7 first of the following year;
- 8 (3) "Approved private institution", a nonprofit institution, dedicated to educational
 9 purposes, located in Missouri which:
- (a) Is operated privately under the control of an independent board and not
 directly controlled or administered by any public agency or political subdivision;
- (b) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six months in length
 leading to or directly creditable toward a certificate or degree;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

(c) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by either the North Central
Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools or by other accrediting bodies recognized
by the United States Office of Education or by utilizing accreditation standards applicable
to nondegree-granting institutions as established by the coordinating board for higher
education;

(d) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty and staff or in the admission of students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin and is in compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive orders issued pursuant thereto. Sex discrimination as used herein shall not apply to admission practices of institutions offering the enrollment limited to one sex;

(e) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without influence or pressure by
 any religious or sectarian source;

26 (4) "Approved public institution", an educational institution located in Missouri27 which:

(a) Is directly controlled or administered by a public agency or political
 subdivision;

30 (b) Receives appropriations directly or indirectly from the general assembly for
 31 operating expenses;

(c) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six months in length
 leading to or directly creditable toward a degree or certificate;

(d) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by either the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, or if a public junior college created under the provisions of sections 178.370 to 178.400, RSMo, meets the standards established by the coordinating board for higher education for such public junior colleges, or by other accrediting bodies recognized by the United States Office of Education or by utilizing accreditation standards applicable to the institution as established by the coordinating board for higher education;

41 (e) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty and staff or in the
42 admission of students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin and is
43 otherwise in compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive
44 orders issued pursuant thereto;

45 (f) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without influence or pressure by
 46 any religious or sectarian source;

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(5) "Coordinating board", the coordinating board for higher education;

48 (6) "Full-time student", an individual who is enrolled in and is carrying sufficient 49 number of credit hours or their equivalent at an approved private or public institution to

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50 secure the degree or certificate toward which he or she is working in no more than the

51 number of semesters or their equivalent normally required by that institution in the 52 program in which the individual is enrolled.

2. There is hereby established a "Higher Education Academic Scholarship Program",
 popularly known as "Bright Flight", and any moneys appropriated by the general assembly
 for this program shall be used to provide scholarships for Missouri citizens to attend a Missouri
 college or university of their choice pursuant to the provisions of this section.

57 [2. The definitions of terms set forth in section 173.205 shall be applicable to such terms 58 as used in this section. The term "academic scholarship" means an amount of money paid by the 59 state of Missouri to a qualified college or university student who has demonstrated superior 60 academic achievement pursuant to the provisions of this section.]

3. The coordinating board for higher education shall be the administrative agency for theimplementation of the program established by this section, and shall:

(1) Promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the exercise of its functions and the
 effectuation of the purposes of this section, including regulations for granting scholarship
 deferments;

66 (2) Prescribe the form and the time and method of awarding academic scholarships, and 67 shall supervise the processing thereof; and

(3) Select qualified recipients to receive academic scholarships, make such awards of
 academic scholarships to qualified recipients and determine the manner and method of payment
 to the recipient.

4. A student shall be eligible for initial or renewed academic scholarship if he or she [is requirement of financial need and undergraduate status, and] :

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(1) Is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;

(2) Is a resident of the State of Missouri, as determined by reference to standards
 promulgated by the coordinating board;

(3) Is enrolled, or has been accepted for enrollment, as a full-time student in an
approved private or public institution; and

(4) Is not enrolled or does not intend to use the award to enroll in a course of study
leading to a degree in theology or divinity.

5. If an applicant is found guilty of or pleads guilty to any criminal offense during the period of time in which the applicant is receiving financial assistance, such applicant shall not be eligible for renewal of such assistance, provided such offense would disqualify the applicant from receiving federal student aid under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended.

6. In addition [meets] to the requirements of subsections 4 and 5 of this section, to
be eligible for initial or renewed academic scholarship the student shall meet the following
requirements:

(1) Initial academic scholarships shall be offered in the academic year immediately following graduation from high school to Missouri high school seniors whose composite scores on the American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Board are in the top five percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high school. In the freshman year of college, scholarship recipients are required to maintain status as a full-time student;

(2) Academic scholarships are renewable if the recipient remains in compliance with the
[applicable] provisions of subsections 4 and 5 of this section [173.215 and], the recipient
makes satisfactory academic degree progress as a full-time student, and the recipient maintains
a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at the institution of higher education.

99 [5.]7. A student who is enrolled or has been accepted for enrollment as a postsecondary 100 student at an approved private or public institution beginning with the fall 1987, term and who 101 meets the other eligibility requirements for an academic scholarship shall, within the limits of 102 the funds appropriated and made available, be offered an academic scholarship in the amount of:

(1) Two thousand dollars for each eligible student whose composite scores on the
American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College
Board are in the top three percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the school
year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high school for each fiscal year prior to
fiscal year 2011[, and,];

(2) Subject to appropriations, [three thousand dollars] the amount of tuition but in no
case more than the average tuition as defined and calculated in subsection 7 of section
173.1003 for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter[,]; and [one thousand dollars]

(3) One-half of the amount provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter for each eligible student whose composite scores on the American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Board are between the top five and three percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high school, for the first academic year of study[, which scholarship].

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8. Such scholarships shall be renewable in the amount of:

(1) Two thousand dollars for each eligible student whose composite scores on the
 American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College
 Board are in the top three percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the school

(2) Subject to appropriations, [three thousand dollars] the amount of tuition but in no
case more than the average tuition as defined and calculated in subsection 7 of section
173.1003 for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter[,]; and [one thousand dollars]

126 (3) One-half of the amount provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection for fiscal 127 year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter for each eligible student whose composite scores on 128 the American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the 129 College Board are between the top five and three percent of all Missouri students taking those 130 tests during the school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high school, 131 annually for the second, third and fourth academic years or as long as the recipient is in 132 compliance with the applicable eligibility requirements set forth in [section 173.215] subsections 133 4, 5, and 6 of this section, provided those years of study are continuous and the student 134 continues to meet eligibility requirements for the scholarship; provided, however, if a recipient 135 ceases all attendance at an approved public or private institution for the purpose of providing 136 service to a nonprofit organization, a state or federal government agency or any branch of the 137 armed forces of the United States, the recipient shall be eligible for a renewal scholarship upon 138 return to any approved public or private institution, provided the recipient:

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(1) Returns to full-time status within twenty-seven months;

(2) Provides verification in compliance with coordinating board for higher education
rules that the service to the nonprofit organization was satisfactorily completed and was not
compensated other than for expenses or that the service to the state or federal governmental
agency or branch of the armed forces of the United States was satisfactorily completed; and

144 (3) Meets all other requirements established for eligibility to receive a renewal 145 scholarship.

146 [6.]**9.** A recipient of academic scholarship awarded under this section may transfer from 147 one approved Missouri public or private institution to another without losing eligibility for the 148 scholarship. If a recipient of the scholarship at any time withdraws from an approved private or 149 public institution so that under the rules and regulations of that institution he or she is entitled 150 to a refund of any tuition, fees or other charges, the institution shall pay the portion of the refund 151 attributable to the scholarship for that term to the coordinating board for higher education.

[7.] **10.** Other provisions of this section to the contrary notwithstanding, if a recipient has been awarded an initial academic scholarship pursuant to the provisions of this section but is unable to use the scholarship during the first academic year because of illness, disability, pregnancy or other medical need or if a recipient ceases all attendance at an approved public or private institution because of illness, disability, pregnancy or other medical need, the recipient

shall be eligible for an initial or renewal scholarship upon enrollment in or return to anyapproved public or private institution, provided the recipient:

159 (1) Enrolls in or returns to full-time status within twenty-seven months;

(2) Provides verification in compliance with coordinating board for higher education
rules of sufficient medical evidence documenting an illness, disability, pregnancy or other
medical need of such person to require that that person will not be able to use the initial or
renewal scholarship during the time period for which it was originally offered; and

164 (3) Meets all other requirements established for eligibility to receive an initial or a 165 renewal scholarship.

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
