12 13 14 15	Whereas, the wounded service personnel of the United States military deserve a guarantee that their signing bonuses will not be ordered to be repaid or withheld as a result of their sacrifice:
16 17 18 19 20 21	Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby urge the United States Congress to enact legislation ending the current United States Defense Department practice of requiring wounded service personnel to pay back signing bonuses as a result of medical discharges for combat injuries; and
