## AN ACT

To amend chapter 407, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to identity theft.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 407, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 407.2030, to read as follows:

- 407.2030. 1. A person who has learned or reasonably suspects that he or she has
- 2 been the victim of identity theft may contact the local law enforcement agency that has
- 3 jurisdiction over his or her actual residence, which shall take a police report of the matter,
- 4 and provide the complainant with a copy of that report. Notwithstanding the fact that
- 5 jurisdiction may lie elsewhere for investigation and prosecution of a crime of identity theft,
- 6 the local law enforcement agency shall take the complaint and provide the complainant
- 7 with a copy of the complaint and may refer the complaint to a law enforcement agency in
- 8 that different jurisdiction.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

2. Nothing in this section interferes with the discretion of a local police department to allocate resources for investigations of crimes. A complaint filed under this section is not required to be counted as an open case for purposes such as compiling open case statistics.
