AN ACT

To repeal section 337.029, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the state committee of psychologists.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 337.029, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 337.029, to read as follows:

337.029. 1. A psychologist licensed in another jurisdiction who has had no violationsand no suspensions and no revocation of a license to practice psychology in any jurisdiction may

3 receive a license in Missouri, provided the psychologist passes a written examination on

- 4 Missouri laws and regulations governing the practice of psychology and meets one of the

- (1) Is a diplomate of the American Board of Professional Psychology;
- (2) Is a member of the National Register of Health Service Providers in Psychology;

- 8 (3) Is currently licensed or certified as a psychologist in another jurisdiction who is then 9 a signatory to the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Board's reciprocity agreement; (4) Is currently licensed or certified as a psychologist in another state, territory of the 10 United States, or the District of Columbia and: 11 12 (a) Has a doctoral degree in psychology from a program accredited, or provisionally accredited, by the American Psychological Association or that meets the requirements as set 13 forth in subdivision (3) of subsection 3 of section 337.025; 14 15 (b) Has been licensed for the preceding five years; and 16 (c) Has had no disciplinary action taken against the license for the preceding five years; 17 or 18 (5) [Is currently licensed or certified as a psychologist in a state, territory of the United 19 States, or the District of Columbia that extends like privileges for reciprocal licensing or certification to persons licensed by this state with similar qualifications; or 20 21 (6)] Holds a current certificate of professional qualification (CPQ) issued by the 22 Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB). 23 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1 of this section, applicants may be 24 required to pass an oral examination as adopted by the committee. 25 3. A psychologist who receives a license for the practice of psychology in the state of Missouri on the basis of reciprocity as listed in subsection 1 of this section or by endorsement 26 27 of the score from the examination of professional practice in psychology score will also be 28 eligible for and shall receive certification from the committee as a health service provider if the 29 psychologist meets one or more of the following criteria: 30 (1) Is a diplomate of the American Board of Professional Psychology in one or more of the specialties recognized by the American Board of Professional Psychology as pertaining to 31 32 health service delivery; 33 (2) Is a member of the National Register of Health Service Providers in Psychology; or 34 (3) Has completed or obtained through education, training, or experience the requisite 35 knowledge comparable to that which is required pursuant to section 337.033.
