	Whereas, competition in the voice communications industry is developing rapidly
2	and is widespread in the State of Missouri; and

4	Whereas, Missouri law governing the telecommunications industry must evolve
5	to meet the needs of Missouri consumers; and

7 8 9	Whereas, consumer choice in voice communications is available through the traditional wireline, wireless, cable, and interconnected voice over Internet protocol industries; and

11 12 13 14	Whereas, the methodology by which carriers are compensated for the use of their network is, by its nature, complex, detailed, and inter-related to numerous other economic forces; and
15 16 17	Whereas, the need to make equitable changes in the inter-carrier compensation regime will require a comprehensive, holistic, and deliberate approach to reform; and
18 19 20	Whereas, due to the complex nature of inter-carrier compensation, comprehensive study and discussion is required; and
21 22 23	Whereas, a forum for review and discussion between these very competitive industries will aid in addressing the concerns of both the industry and consumers:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the members of the House of 24 Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate 25 concurring therein, that to ensure that thoughtful and necessary changes to the regulation of voice 26 27 communications in Missouri and the need to protect Missouri consumers and provide them with 28 more communications choices, the General Assembly must endeavor to comprehensively study 29 further the matters detailed herein: and

Be it further resolved that the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate appoint a Joint Interim Committee on Voice 32 33 Communications Regulation that is authorized to function during the legislative interim between 34 the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly and the First Regular Session 35 of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly to study the following:

37 (1) The need to make changes to the inter-carrier compensation system wherein voice 38 communications providers exchange traffic on other provider's networks; and

40 (2) Such other matters as the Joint Interim Committee may deem necessary in order to 41 determine the proper course of future legislative and budgetary action regarding inter-carrier 42 compensation; and

Be it further resolved that the Joint Interim Committee shall prepare a final 44 report, together with its recommendations for any legislative action deemed necessary for 45 submission to the General Assembly prior to commencement of the First Regular Session of the 46 47 Ninety-fifth General Assembly; and

Be it further resolved that the Joint Interim Committee may solicit input 49 50 and information necessary to fulfill its obligations, including but not limited to soliciting input 51 and information from any state department or agency the Joint Interim Committee deems 52 relevant, consumer advocates, political subdivisions of this State, and the general public; and 53

Be it further resolved that the staffs of House Research, the Joint 54 Committee on Legislative Research, and Senate Research shall provide such legal, research, 55

- clerical, technical, and bill drafting services as the Joint Interim Committee may require in theperformance of its duties; and

59 **Be it further resolved** that the actual and necessary expenses of the Joint 60 Interim Committee, its members, and any staff assigned to the Joint Interim Committee incurred 61 by the Joint Interim Committee shall be paid by the Joint Contingent Fund.
