

House Concurrent Resolution No. 41

2 **Whereas**, sport fishing is a great industry, recreation, and occupation in Missouri;
3 and

4 **Whereas**, hand fishing, which is also referred to as "noodling", for channel, blue,
5 and flathead catfish is one of the ultimate challenges in the arena of sport fishing; and
6

7 **Whereas**, a growing number of catfishermen in Missouri, which includes men,
8 women, and children, wish to participate in the age-old and challenging sport of hand fishing for
9 catfish; and
10

11 **Whereas**, hand fishing is a legalized sport in 13 states, 6 of which border Missouri;
12 and
13

14 **Whereas**, hand fishing studies have been conducted in some of these legal states
15 which have shown to have no adverse or minimal effect on their catfish population; and
16

17 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation, Fisheries Division, when
18 taking into account the impact of current liberal regulations relating to catfishing in Missouri,
19 has not presented any compelling biological evidence that suggest legalizing hand fishing in
20 Missouri would harm the resources; and
21

22 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation has stated that there are
23 approximately 664,000 catfish anglers in Missouri, and by Missouri law, they can catch 5
24 flatheads, 5 blue cats, and 10 channel catfish, or 20 catfish a day, 365 days a year, or 7,300
25 catfish for each permit sold; and
26

27 **Whereas**, Dr. Mark Morgan at the University of Missouri-Columbia conducted a
28 study and found that there are approximately 2,000 hand fishers in Missouri; and
29

30 **Whereas**, these hand fishermen are asking the Missouri Department of
31 Conservation to allow them to hand catch 5 channel, blue, or flathead catfish in a 61-day
32 statewide season for each permit sold, which would be 0.000685 percent of the 7,300 catfish now
33 allowed each catfish angler in Missouri; and
34

35 **Whereas**, during the 2005 and 2006 Missouri Department of Conservation's trial
36 hand fishing season, there were only 159 hand fishing permits sold, and out of the 159 permits
37 only 83 hand fishermen actually fished; and
38

39 **Whereas**, these 83 hand fishermen only caught and kept 27 catfish, and caught and
40 released 20 catfish in 201 trips on the Mississippi and South Fabius, two of the three rivers that
41 were legal to hand fish in 2005 and 2006; and
42

43 **Whereas**, the other catfish anglers that fished on the Mississippi and South Fabius
44 in 2005 and 2006 caught 341 catfish that had been tagged by the Missouri Department of
45 Conservation; and
46

47 **Whereas**, the hand fishermen that fished on the Mississippi and South Fabius in
48 2005 and 2006 caught only 1 catfish that had been tagged by the Missouri Department of
49 Conservation; and
50

51 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation canceled the five-year
52 experimental trial hand fishing season after two years for no valid reason; and
53

54 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation survey of 6,000 catfish anglers
55 in 2004 showed 51% supported a regulated hand fishing season, with only 22.9% opposed; and
56

57 **Whereas**, the USDA Forest Service statewide survey of Missouri citizens
58 conducted in 2004 showed 68% supported a regulated season and only 7% opposed; and
59

60 **Whereas**, the second USDA Forest Service statewide survey of Missouri citizens
61 in 2006 showed 70% in support and 9% opposed; and
62

63 **Whereas**, the legalization of hand fishing is supported by the Missouri Farm
64 Bureau, the Missouri Farmer's Union, MoFED, and the Missouri Trappers Association; and
65

66 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation is responsible for all Missouri
67 state fishing and game regulations, and should provide hand fishers with appropriate information
68 and regulations; and
69

70 **Whereas**, recognizing and respecting the Research Division of the Missouri
71 Department of Conservation, they should continue balanced research on hand fishing for
72 channel, blue, and flathead catfish in conjunction with the catfish harvest evaluation project
73 (CHEP); and
74

75 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation's out-of-state Independent
76 Science Review Panel recommended further hand fishing evaluation; and
77

78 **Whereas**, the Missouri Department of Conservation's mission statement states "to
79 provide opportunity for all citizens to use, enjoy and learn about fish, forest and wildlife
80 resources";
81

82 **Now, therefore, be it resolved** that the members of the House of
83 Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate
84 concurring therein, hereby strongly encourage the Missouri Department of Conservation to have
85 a pilot regulated statewide hand fishing season for channel, blue, and flathead catfish from June
86 first to July thirty-first, beginning in 2008, to allow hand fishers to take 5 of these fish by hand;

89 **Be it further resolved** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
90 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for John
91 Hoskins, Director of the Department of Conservation and each commission of the Conservation
92 Commission of Missouri.
