FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Public Safety, Department of Natural Resources and Missouri Highway Patrol assume no fiscal impact to their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume currently, they cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase of direct offender costs either through incarceration (FY08 average of \$15.64 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$5,709 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY08 average of \$2.47 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$902 per offender).

The following factors contribute to DOC's minimal assumption:

- > DOC assumes the narrow scope of the crime will not encompass a large number of offenders.
- >The low felony status of the crime enhances the possibility of plea-bargaining or imposition of a probation sentence.
- > The probability exists that offenders would be charged with a similar but more serious offense or that sentences may run concurrent to one another.

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in some additional costs, but it is assume the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.
