FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** state this proposed legislation has no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** state that this amendment is more restrictive than current federal requirements which measure fat content over the school week rather than the school day. This requirement will lead to higher food costs for school districts. DESE cannot estimate those increased costs.

Officials from the **Blue Springs School District** state this proposal would reduce revenue for their district by \$400,000 annually.

This proposal was sent to several other school districts who did not respond to a request for fiscal note.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation requires school meals to derive no more than 30% of their calories from fat and to limit saturated fat to less than 10% of the calories as measured over the school day including breakfast and lunch.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
