### AN ACT

To repeal section 578.012, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to animal abuse, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 578.012, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 578.012, to read as follows:

578.012. 1. A person is guilty of animal abuse when a person:

- (1) Intentionally or purposely kills an animal in any manner not allowed by or expressly
  exempted from the provisions of sections 578.005 to 578.023 and 273.030, RSMo;
  - (2) Purposely or intentionally causes injury or suffering to an animal; or
- 5 (3) Having ownership or custody of an animal knowingly fails to provide adequate care 6 or adequate control.
- 2. Animal abuse is a class A misdemeanor, unless the defendant has previously plead
  guilty to or has been found guilty of animal abuse or the suffering involved in subdivision (2)
  of subsection 1 of this section is the result of torture or mutilation, or both, consciously inflicted
- 10 while the animal was alive, in which case it is a class D felony.
- 3. If a defendant is charged under this section with animal abuse based on injury to the real or personal property of another person, it shall be an affirmative defense to all criminal liability that the injury to the property of another is less than thirty-five hundred dollars, or less than the jurisdictional maximum of the small claims court in the county
- 15 where the criminal charges are pending, whichever is greater.
