Whereas, the 111th United States Congress is considering the Freedom of Choice Act, which purports to classify abortion as a "fundamental right", equal in stature to the right of 2 free speech and the right to vote - rights that, unlike abortion, are specifically enumerated in the 3 United States Constitution; and 4 5 Whereas, the federal Freedom of Choice Act would invalidate any "statute, 6 ordinance, regulation, administrative order, decision, policy, practice, or other action" of any 7 federal, state, or local government or governmental office, or any person acting under 8 9 governmental authority that would "deny or interfere with a woman's right to choose" abortion, or that would "discriminate against the exercise of the right...in the regulation or provision of 10 benefits, facilities, services, or information"; and 11 12 Whereas, the federal Freedom of Choice Act would nullify any federal or state law 13 "enacted, adopted, or implemented before, on, or after the date of its enactment" and would 14 15 effectively prevent the State of Missouri from enacting similar protective measures in the future; 16 and 17 Whereas, the federal Freedom of Choice Act would invalidate more than 550 18 federal and state abortion-related laws, laws supported by the majority of the American people; 19 20 and 21 Whereas, the federal Freedom of Choice Act would specifically invalidate the 22 following commonsense protective laws properly enacted by the State of Missouri: 23 24 (1) A parental consent law for minors seeking an abortion; 25 26
