AN ACT

To amend chapter 195, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to confidentiality of prescriptive information, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 195, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 195.085, to read as follows:

195.085. 1. Records relative to prescription information containing patient-

- identifiable and prescriber-identifiable data shall not be licensed, transferred, used, or sold 2
- by any pharmacy benefits manager, insurance company, electronic transmission
- intermediary, retail, mail order, or Internet pharmacy or other similar entity for any
- commercial purpose, except for the limited purpose of pharmacy reimbursement;
- formulary compliance, care management; utilization review by a health care provider, the
- 7 patient's insurance provider, or the agent of either; health care research; or as otherwise
- provided by law. Commercial purposes includes, but is not limited to, advertising,
- marketing, promotion, or any activity that could be used to influence sales or market share
- 10 of a pharmaceutical product, influence or evaluate the prescribing behavior of an
- individual health care professional, or evaluate the effectiveness of a professional 11
- 12 pharmaceutical detailing sales force. 13
 - 2. Nothing in this section shall prohibit:
- 14 (1) The dispensing of prescription medications to a patient or a patient's authorized 15 representative;
- 16 (2) The transmission of prescription information between an authorized prescriber 17 and a licensed pharmacy;

- (4) The transfer of prescription records that may occur in the event a pharmacy ownership is changed or transferred;
- (5) Care management educational communications provided to a patient about the patient's health condition, adherence to a prescribed course of therapy, or other information about the drug being dispensed, treatment options, and clinical trials;
- (6) The collection, use, transfer, or sale of patient and prescriber de-identified data by zip code, geographic region, or medical specialty for commercial purposes.
- 3. In addition to any other remedies available at law, any person who violates this section is guilty of a class A misdemeanor and shall be subject to licensure sanction by the appropriate licensing body. Any second or subsequent violation of this section is a class D felony.

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
