18 19 20 21 22	Whereas, state and local organizations, including the Missouri Military Preparedness and Enhancement Commission, the Warrensburg City Council, the Whiteman Area Leadership Council, the Whiteman Air Force Base Community Council, the Military Affairs Committee of the Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce, and the Daily Star-Journal, support the choice of Whiteman Air Force Base as the permanent headquarters for Global Strike Command:
