Whereas, Missouri's Katy Trail attracts hundreds of thousands of bicyclists eac year from all 50 states and from across the globe, providing economic, health, and scenic benefit to the citizens of Missouri and the world; and

Whereas, Missouri hosts four major cross-country bicycle tourism routes that attract thousands of cross-country and local bicyclists each year, including the Mississipp River/Great Rivers Trail, the American Discovery Trail, the Lewis and Clark Trail, and the TransAmerica Trail; and
