#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Agriculture**, **Department of Transportation**, **Department of Conservation** and **Public Service Commission** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** assume under Section 444.772.14 no permit application in which the mine plan calls for blasting may be approved until the department director, or his or her designee, holds a public meeting with an opportunity to comment on the permit request.

It is estimated, based on the current economy, the department receives approximately 50 new applications per year that involve blasting. The volume could increase if/when the economy would improve. Based on the current number of applications, each public meeting would require approximately 40 hours preparation, planning, travel to and from meeting place and the meeting itself.

The department estimates that one Environmental Services III FTE would be needed to carry out these additional activities. The department's fee funds are experiencing funding challenges which would make it difficult to absorb any additional responsibilities without additional resources. Therefore, the department has quantified the anticipated ongoing fiscal impact. The bill language does not provide for funding these additional activities, therefore, General Revenue would be requested.

**Oversight** assumes the Department of Natural Resources could absorb the cost of these FTE within their current appropriation level. If multiple initiatives are validated which require similar endeavours at substantial costs, the Department of Natural Resources could request funding through the appropriation process.
