ASSUMPTION

Section 191.015:

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** and the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions & Professional Registration** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** assume the legislation is based on the HHS Privacy Rule. The MO HealthNet Division is already required to comply with the Privacy Rule; therefore, there is no fiscal impact.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** states the Department has multiple rules, regulations, practices and procedures currently in place to provide protections against the disclosure of patient/client/consumer or employee personal information. The implementation of this proposed legislation would not appear to create a fiscal impact to DMH.
