Bill Summary: This proposal allows money from the county law enforcement restitution fund to be used for county inmate work and service programs and limits the amount a county can assess an individual for certain offenses to \$10.

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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, Boone County Sheriff's Department, and St. Louis County**, assume there will be no fiscal impact to their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** state there will be no measurable fiscal impact on their agency or County Prosecutors.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** state the proposed legislation allows counties to establish an inmate work and service program. In addition, it would allow the court to order a person to pay up to ten dollars into the county law enforcement restitution fund for various traffic offenses.

Traffic cases are technically misdemeanors, and if as an alternative to a traffic conviction, a defendant can get a suspended sentence for payment into the county law enforcement fund, the potential volume could be in the hundreds of thousands of cases. If cases that would otherwise have resulted in a conviction are shifted to a suspended imposition or execution of a sentence, it is likely to result in the loss of revenue from fines to the schools, crime victims' compensation, law enforcement training and other earmarked funds.

Currently, the total cost for a traffic ticket stands at \$56.50. This proposal would significantly increase the cost of those tickets where the fee was assessed.

Oversight assumes this proposal as written is enabling legislation and would require action by the county's governing body or by citizen petition with voter approval before fiscal impact would be realized. Oversight assumes no state or local fiscal impact.

The following sheriffs' departments did not respond to **Oversight's** request for a fiscal impact: **Buchanan County Sheriff, Clark County Sheriff, Green County Sheriff, Jackson County Sheriff, St. Louis County Sheriff, and Platte County Sheriff.**

The following counties did not respond to **Oversight's** request for a fiscal impact: **Boone, Butler, Callaway, Cass, Clay, Cole, Cooper, Greene, Jackson, Jasper, Laclede, Lafayette, Lawrence, Lincoln, Texas, and Warren.**

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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill allows money from the county law enforcement restitution fund to be used for county inmate work and service programs. The amount a county can assess an individual for a plea of guilty or the finding of guilt for a charge of speeding, careless and imprudent driving, or violating a traffic signal or sign or for any class C misdemeanor or infraction is limited to \$10 which will be deposited into the fund.

The bill also authorizes county commissions or other governing bodies, in conjunction with the county sheriff, to establish an inmate work and service program within a county or regional jail. Provisions regarding inmate eligibility in the program, petitioning the court for admission to the program, refusal to participate by certain inmates, suspending the program by the sheriff, and certain immunities from liability for those performing supervisory duties in the program are included in the bill.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.

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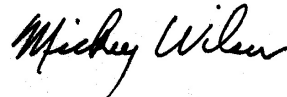
