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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions, and Professional Registration, Department of Mental Health, Department of Health and Senior Services, and the Department of Social Services assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed within existing resources. In addition, AGO assumes there will be a potential savings to the legal expense fund, as the proposal defines "summer camp" thereby limiting claims that could be made for coverage. As the "summer camp" coverage was enacted in 2009, the number of such claims is unknown.

Officials from the **Office of Administration** assume the proposed legislative changes to the legal expense fund have the potential for some cost savings.

**Oversight** assumes the number of claims that would be excluded as a result of defining "summer camp" would be minimal. Therefore, Oversight reflects no savings as a result of the proposal.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this proposal for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the SOS can sustain with their core budget. Any additional required funding would be handled through the budget process.
