FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on the Courts.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections** and the **Office of State Public Defender** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** state this proposed legislation will have no measurable fiscal impact on their agency or on County Prosecutors.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** state the changes outlined in this proposed legislation will require DOR to modify current forms, procedures and website information related to reporting of impaired or unsafe drivers.

DOR anticipates the volume of reports received from the EMT's can be processed with existing resources. If the volume increased to an unmanageable workload, DOR will pursue additional resources through the appropriation process; however, DOR will incur the following costs in FY 11:

DOR states no programming changes or equipment is required for the proposed change.

It is unknown as to how many of the EMT reports received would generate a revocation/reinstatement of the driver license which could have a revenue impact.

Oversight assumes DOR is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. **Oversight** assumes DOR could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, DOR could request
