FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DOLIR)** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the passage of this proposed legislation would require zero increase in state cost and has the benefit of reducing public school district facility construction costs significantly. DESE was unable to estimate the amount of this potential savings.

Officials from the **Francis Howell School District** and the **Special School District of St Louis County** state they are in charter counties and this proposed legislation does not apply to their districts.

Officials from the **Parkway School District** and the **Independence School District** assume no fiscal impact. **Oversight** notes these school districts are in non-charter counties and are not affected by this proposed legislation.

Oversight sent fiscal note response requests to several other school districts; however, they have not responded. In response to a similar proposal from 2006 (HB 1811 - FN 4966-01), these local school districts responded as follows:

Officials from the **Poplar Bluff School District** assumed the proposal would have a positive fiscal impact on schools.

Officials from the **Joplin School District**, based on previous renovation costs, assumed a 25% savings in construction costs could be realized with the passage of the proposed legislation.

Oversight assumes that not all school districts with pending construction projects may elect out of the prevailing wage requirements and not all construction and renovation projects would be undertaken; however, **Oversight** assumes savings could exceed \$100,000 in any given year statewide.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation establishes the School Construction Act which exempts, except in counties with a charter form of government (St Louis County, St Charles, Jackson), the construction and maintenance work done on behalf of a school from the prevailing hourly wage rate requirement upon the approval of the school board. If a school district exempts itself, it must notify the Division of Labor Standards within the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of the exemption.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
