ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume the approximate state savings if the Dollar Value Modifier is 1.00:

FY10 - \$ 98.7 million

FY11 - \$126.6 million # (increases because the phase-in percentage for SB 287 formula increases, but with no DVM the amount does not increase as much)

FY10 calculations were made using the February 2010 data set and the FY 11 calculations were made using the data set for the FY11 budget request.

Oversight assumes school districts would have a corresponding loss in state aid.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation revises the definition of "dollar-value modifier," a cost-of-living index based on federal statistics of wages by county and region contained in the school funding formula, by setting the value of the modifier for all districts at 1.0 beginning with Fiscal Year 2011. Currently, the modifier cannot be applied at a rate less than 1.0.

The bill contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
