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### JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment to article I of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section relating to the right to raise animals.

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*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:*

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next  
2 following the first Monday in November, 2010, or at a special election to be called by the  
3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for  
4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to article I of the Constitution of the state of  
5 Missouri:

Section A. Article I, Constitution of Missouri, is amended by adding one new section,  
2 to be known as section 35, to read as follows:

**Section 35. That agriculture which provides food, energy, and security is the**  
2 **foundation and stabilizing force of Missouri's economy. To protect this vital sector of**  
3 **Missouri's economy, it shall be the right of citizens to raise domesticated animals in a**  
4 **humane manner without the state imposing an undue economic burden on animal owners.**  
5 **Notwithstanding that this section shall in no way prohibit or limit the right of any county**  
6 **or city to enact ordinances, no state law criminalizing or otherwise regulating crops or the**  
7 **welfare of any domesticated animals shall be valid unless based upon generally accepted**  
8 **scientific principles and enacted by the general assembly. Nothing in this section shall be**  
9 **construed to invalidate a law that makes it a criminal activity to grow a crop that has been**  
10 **declared a controlled substance under the laws of this state.**

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EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
