	Whereas, lesbian, gay, and bisexual Americans have served honorably in the med Forces throughout United States history and continue to serve with distinction on active ty, including in the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan; and

7 orie	Whereas, the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy currently does not allow openly bian, gay, or bisexual Americans to serve in the military only because of their sexual entation; and

11 ser	Whereas , more than 12,000 service members have been discharged under the on't Ask, Don't Tell" policy since the policy was enacted in 1993, including approximately 800 vice members who performed heavily specialized jobs, such as Arabic translators, medical ecialists, pilots, and intelligence personnel; and
	Whereas, American taxpayers have spent more then \$250 million to carry out the on't Ask, Don't Tell" policy by removing and replacing qualified and honorable service mbers because of their sexual orientation; and
20 wh	Whereas, the United States military's readiness to protect and defend our nation everely compromised by spending taxpayer money to discharge honorable service members o are satisfactorily carrying out all required tasks, many of which are highly specialized, king it difficult to find qualified replacement personnel; and

Whereas, every Department of Defense authorized study has shown that there is 25 no correlation between sexual orientation and unit cohesion in the Armed Forces; and 26 27 Whereas, there are more than 20,000 military and civilian personnel stationed in 28 Missouri, and an estimated 9,000 lesbian, gay, or bisexual veterans currently reside in Missouri: 29 30 Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the members of the Missouri House 31 of Representatives, Ninety-fifth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate 32 33 concurring therein, hereby support the Military Readiness Enhancement Act that would replace the current "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy with a policy of nondiscrimination based on sexual 34 orientation, and respectfully urge the Congress to pass and the President to sign the Military 35 36 Readiness Enhancement Act so that lesbian, gay, and bisexual Americans are able to serve their 37 country as any other American would be allowed to serve; and 38
