2 3	Whereas, civil aviation plays a pivotal role in promoting cultural exchange business, trade, and tourism; and
4 5 6	Whereas, to develop international civil aviation in a safe and orderly manner is the supreme cause of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO); and
7 8 9	Whereas, Taiwan is the world's 20th largest economy, 18th largest trading country and a key air transport hub linking Northeast and Southeast Asia; and
10 11 12 13	Whereas, over 174,000 international flights travel to and from Taiwan, with foreign passengers making approximately 3.8 million trips to the island every year, and over 35 million passengers, including 25.39 million passengers on international flights, arrived and departed from Taiwan's airports in 2008; and
15 16 17	Whereas, without Taiwan's participation, international flight plans, regulations and procedures that ICAO formulates will be incomplete; and
18 19 20	Whereas, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy Review, the United States declared its intention to support Taiwan's participation in appropriate international organizations; and
21 22	Whereas, the State of Missouri and Taiwan have entered into Sister State relationship since 1980, with both sides highly regarding this mutually beneficial link:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby endorses an observer status for Taiwan in the International Civil Aviation Organization; and
