HJR 72 -- Executive Branch Term Limits

Sponsor: Smith (150)

Currently, the Missouri Constitution limits an individual from being elected Governor or State Treasurer more than twice. Also, anyone who serves as the acting Governor or State Treasurer for more than two years and who was not elected to the office may run for election only once.

Upon voter approval, this proposed constitutional amendment adds these term limitations to persons running for the office of Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, or State Auditor.
