Amend SCS House Bill No. 142, Page 2, Section 55.030, Line 31.

2 by inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "162.481. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section,  
4 all elections of school directors in urban districts shall be  
5 held biennially at the same times and places as municipal  
6 elections.

7 2. In any urban district which includes all or the major  
8 part of a city which first obtained a population of more than  
9 seventy-five thousand inhabitants by reason of the 1960 federal  
10 decennial census, elections of directors shall be held on  
11 municipal election days of even-numbered years. The directors of  
12 the prior district shall continue as directors of the urban  
13 district until their successors are elected as herein provided.  
14 On the first Tuesday in April, 1964, four directors shall be  
15 elected, two for terms of two years to succeed the two directors  
16 of the prior district who were elected in 1960 and two for terms  
17 of six years to succeed the two directors of the prior district  
18 who were elected in 1961. The successors of these directors  
19 shall be elected for terms of six years. On the first Tuesday in  
20 April, 1968, two directors shall be elected for terms to commence  
21 on November 5, 1968, and to terminate on the first Tuesday in  
22 April, 1974, when their successors shall be elected for terms of

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1 six years. No director shall serve more than two consecutive  
2 six-year terms after October 13, 1963.

3 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4 of this  
4 section, hereafter when a seven-director district becomes an  
5 urban district, the directors of the prior seven-director  
6 district shall continue as directors of the urban district until  
7 the expiration of the terms for which they were elected and until  
8 their successors are elected as provided in this subsection.  
9 The first biennial school election for directors shall be held in  
10 the urban district at the time provided in subsection 1 which is  
11 on the date of or subsequent to the expiration of the terms of  
12 the directors of the prior district which are first to expire,  
13 and directors shall be elected to succeed the directors of the  
14 prior district whose terms have expired. If the terms of two  
15 directors only have expired, the directors elected at the first  
16 biennial school election in the urban district shall be elected  
17 for terms of six years. If the terms of four directors have  
18 expired, two directors shall be elected for terms of six years  
19 and two shall be elected for terms of four years. At the next  
20 succeeding biennial election held in the urban district,  
21 successors for the remaining directors of the prior  
22 seven-director district shall be elected. If only two directors  
23 are to be elected they shall be elected for terms of six years  
24 each. If four directors are to be elected, two shall be elected  
25 for terms of six years and two shall be elected for terms of two  
26 years. After seven directors of the urban district have been  
27 elected under this subsection, their successors shall be elected  
28 for terms of six years.

29 4. In any school district in any city with a population of



1 one hundred thousand or more inhabitants which is located within  
2 a county of the first classification that adjoins no other county  
3 of the first classification, or any school district which becomes  
4 an urban school district by reason of the 2000 federal decennial  
5 census, elections shall be held annually at the same times and  
6 places as general municipal elections for all years where one or  
7 more terms expire, and the terms shall be for three years and  
8 until their successors are duly elected and qualified for all  
9 directors elected on and after August 28, 1998.

10 5. In any school district in any home rule city with more  
11 than one hundred fifty-one thousand five hundred but fewer than  
12 one hundred fifty-one thousand six hundred inhabitants,  
13 candidates for school board election in which more than one seat  
14 on the school board is open, shall declare their candidacy for a  
15 particular seat on the school board. When more than one seat is  
16 open, the election authority shall designate the open seats by  
17 letter so that the candidates for the school board are required  
18 to run for a particular seat that is so designated. The  
19 declaration of candidacy for a particular seat shall be made in  
20 accordance with the procedures of section 162.281. Candidates  
21 shall also be nominated for a designated seat by petition in  
22 accordance with section 162.491."

23 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
