#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator (CTS)** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact the courts. CTS states there are currently no Senior Commissioners. Also, CTS states the Senior Judges are paid \$32.04 per hour worked and cumulatively work 7,680 hours in a given year.

Officials from the **Missouri State Employee Retirement System** state this legislation carries no fiscal impact to the Judicial Plan.

According to the budget request for CTS, the FY 2011 appropriation includes 5.0 FTE Senior Judges, which according to CTS is the total part-time work accumulated for all Senior Judges throughout the state for the year. The appropriation for Senior Judges in FY 2011 is \$246,332, which when divided by the \$32.04 hourly wage equates to roughly 7,680 hours of paid work. The state's minimum wage for 2011 is \$7.25 per hour. Therefore, assuming this 7,680 hours of work by Senior Judges in a given year would be paid at the minimum wage (\$7.25) instead of the current rate (\$32.04), this equate to roughly \$55,680 of pay. Therefore, if all Senior Judges elected to be paid at the minimum wage rate, the state would realize a savings of roughly \$190,000. This proposal is permissive in nature and simply allows Senior Judges to elect to be paid the minimum wage in 'times of budget stress'; therefore, **Oversight** will range the fiscal impact of the proposal from \$0 (not in times of budget stress or no Senior Judges voluntarily reduce their pay) to a potential annual savings of \$190,000. Oversight will reflect a potential 10 months of impact in FY 2012.
