1 AMEND Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 566, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting 2 after all of said section and line, the following:

3 "178.530. 1. The state board of education shall establish standards and annually inspect, as a 4 basis for approval, all public prevocational, vocational schools, Linn State Technical College, departments 5 and classes receiving state or federal moneys for giving training in agriculture, industrial, home economics 6 and commercial subjects and all schools, departments and classes receiving state or federal moneys for the 7 preparation of teachers and supervisors of such subjects. The public prevocational and vocational 8 schools, Linn State Technical College, departments, and classes, and the training schools, departments and 9 classes are entitled to the state or federal moneys so long as they are approved by the state board of 10 education, as to site, plant, equipment, qualifications of teachers, admission of pupils, courses of study 11 and methods of instruction. All disbursements of state or federal moneys for the benefit of the approved 12 prevocational and vocational schools, Linn State Technical College, departments and classes shall be 13 made semiannually. The school board of each approved school or the governing body of Linn State 14 Technical College shall file a report with the state board of education at the times and in the form that the 15 state board requires. Upon receipt of a satisfactory report, the state board of education shall certify to the 16 commissioner of administration for his approval the amount of the state and federal moneys due the 17 school district or Linn State Technical College. The amount due the school district shall be certified by 18 the commissioner of administration and proper warrant therefor shall be issued to the district treasurer or 19 Linn State Technical College. 20 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1 of this section, the state board of education shall establish standards for agricultural education that may be adopted by a private school accredited by 21 22 an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education as an accreditor of private schools 23 that wishes to provide quality vocational programming outside the requirements of, but consistent with, 24 the federal vocational Education Act. Such standards shall be sufficient to qualify a private school to 25 apply to the state chapter for approval of a local chapter of a federally chartered national agricultural 26 education association on a form developed for that purpose by the department of elementary and 27 secondary education without eligibility to receive state or federal funding for agricultural vocational 28 education; however, such private school shall reimburse the department annually for the cost of oversight

29 and maintenance of the program."; and

30 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
