1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 692,
2 Page 68, Section 205.042, Line 41, by inserting after all of said section and line the following:

4 “300.390. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4 of this section, every
5 pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an
6 unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the
7 roadway.

8 2. Any pedestrian crossing a roadway at a point where a pedestrian tunnel or overhead
9 pedestrian crossing has been provided shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the
10 roadway.

11 3. The foregoing rules in this section have no application under the conditions stated in
12 section 300.395 when pedestrians are prohibited from crossing at certain designated places.

13 4. In any home rule city with more than four hundred thousand inhabitants and located in
14 more than one county, vehicles shall yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians and bicyclists
15 crossing in an appropriate crosswalk on a city or neighborhood street. For purposes of this
16 subsection, "yield" means slowing to a stop within forty feet of a pedestrian. A violation of this
17 subsection shall be a class A misdemeanor.”; and

19 Further amend said bill, Page 73, Section 304.120, Line 42, by inserting after all of said section
20 and line, the following:

22 “304.900. 1. Except as provided in subsection 4 of this section, every pedestrian crossing
23 a roadway at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at
24 an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.

25 2. Any pedestrian crossing a roadway at a point where a pedestrian tunnel or overhead
26 pedestrian crossing has been provided shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the
27 roadway.

28 3. In any urbanized area as defined in section 304.010, vehicles shall yield the

1 right-of-way to all pedestrians and bicyclists, even those crossing or operating in areas not
2 designated as cross walks. For purposes of this subsection, "yield" means slowing to a stop within
3 forty feet of a pedestrian. A violation of this subsection shall be a class A misdemeanor.

4 4. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a political subdivision from
5 enacting laws restricting where a person shall or shall not cross a street within a jurisdiction.
6 Notwithstanding any other law, a pedestrian's act of crossing in a prohibited area shall not
7 preclude a cause of action against a driver who has struck a pedestrian.”; and

9 Further amend said bill, Page 77, Section 442.404, Line 28, by inserting after all of said section
10 and line, the following:

12 “577.060. 1. A person commits the crime of leaving the scene of a motor vehicle accident
13 when being the operator or driver of a vehicle on the highway or on any publicly or privately
14 owned parking lot or parking facility generally open for use by the public and knowing that an
15 injury has been caused to a person or damage has been caused to property, due to [his] such
16 person's culpability or to accident, [he] such person leaves the place of the injury, damage or
17 accident without stopping and giving his or her name, residence, including city and street number,
18 motor vehicle number and driver's license number, if any, to the injured party or to a police
19 officer, or if no police officer is in the vicinity, then to the nearest police station or judicial officer.

20 2. For the purposes of this section, all peace officers shall have jurisdiction, when invited
21 by an injured person, to enter the premises of any privately owned parking lot or parking facility
22 for the purpose of investigating an accident and performing all necessary duties regarding such
23 accident.

24 3. Leaving the scene of a motor vehicle accident is a class A misdemeanor, except that it
25 shall be a class D felony if the accident resulted in:

26 (1) Physical injury to another party; or

27 (2) Property damage in excess of one thousand dollars; or

28 (3) If the defendant has previously pled guilty to or been found guilty of a violation of this
29 section.”; and

31 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
32 accordingly.
