a tax credit for eligible costs	incurred in renovating the taxpayer's rented dwelling or residence.	
The tax credit amount shall b	be equal to twenty percent of such eligible costs, but shall not exceed	
two thousand five hundred do	ollars per taxpayer claiming the credit. The amount of the tax credit	
issued shall not exceed the ar	mount of the taxpayer's state tax liability for the tax year for which	
the credit is claimed. If the amount of the tax credit issued exceeds the amount of the taxpayer's
