*94th*AMEND _____, Bill No. ^{HC 555} *SB 769*, Page 1, Section A,Line 3, by inserting after all of said line the following:

"170.310. 1. For school year 2014-15, and each school year thereafter, no pupil shall receive a certificate of graduation from any public, charter, or private school unless he or she has satisfactorily participated in instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation meeting the standards established in this section. Students with disabilities shall participate to the extent appropriate as determined by the provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act.

2. Beginning in school year 2014-15, schools serving grades nine through twelve shall provide enrolled students instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Instruction may be embedded in any health education course. Instruction shall be based on a program established by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, or through a nationally recognized program based on the most current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines, and psychomotor skills development shall be incorporated into the instruction. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use of hands-on practicing and skills testing to support cognitive learning.

3. The teacher of the cardiopulmonary resuscitation course or unit shall not be required to be a certified trainer of cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the instruction is not designed to result in certification of students. Instruction that is designed to result in certification being earned shall be required to be taught by an authorized cardiopulmonary

1 instructor. Schools may develop agreements with any local
2 chapter of a voluntary organization of first responders to
3 provide the required hands-on practice and skills testing.

4 4. The department of elementary and secondary education may
5 promulgate rules to implement this section. Any rule or portion
6 of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is
7 created under the authority delegated in this section shall
8 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all
9 of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section
10 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if
11 any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to
12 chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to
13 disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
14 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any
15 rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid
16 and void.

17 5. The requirements of this section shall not apply to a
18 private school that objects on religious grounds, provided the
19 school maintains its own personnel trained in cardiopulmonary
20 resuscitation."; and

21 Further amend said title, enacting clause and intersectional
22 references accordingly.
