1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for for Senate Bill No. 0767,  
2 Page 19, Section 301.4043, Line 23, by inserting immediately after said line the following:

3 “302.185. In the event that a license issued under sections 302.010 to 302.780 shall be lost or  
4 destroyed or when a veteran seeks a veteran designation under section 302.188 prior to the expiration of a  
5 license, but not where [the] a license has been suspended, taken up, revoked, disqualified, or deposited in  
6 lieu of bail, hereinafter provided, the person to whom the license as was issued may obtain a duplicate  
7 license upon furnishing proper identification and satisfactory proof to the director or his authorized  
8 license agents that the license has been lost or destroyed, and upon payment of a fee of fifteen dollars for a  
9 duplicate license if the person transports persons or property as classified in section 302.015, and a fee of  
10 seven dollars and fifty cents for all other duplicate classifications of license.

11 302.188. 1. A person may apply to the department of revenue to obtain a veteran designation on  
12 a driver's license or identification card issued under this chapter by providing:

13 (1) A United States Department of Defense discharge document, otherwise known as a DD Form  
14 214, that shows a discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions" that establishes  
15 the person's service in the armed forces of the United States; and

16 (2) Payment of the fee for the driver's license or identification card authorized under this chapter.

17 2. If the person is seeking a duplicate driver's license with the veteran designation and his or her  
18 driver's license has not expired, the fee shall be as provided under section 302.185.

19 3. The department of revenue may determine the appropriate placement of the veteran  
20 designation on the driver's licenses and identification cards authorized under this section and may  
21 promulgate the necessary rules for administration of this section.

22 4. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under  
23 the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all  
24 of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are  
25 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review,  
26 to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then  
27 the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid  
28 and void.”; and
