FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency or on school districts.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** stated this proposed legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

According to officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)**, many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the proposal. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal with core funding. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

Officials from the **Parkway School District** anticipate no fiscal impact resulting from this proposed legislation.

In response to a similar proposal from last year (SB 99 - FN 648-04), officials from the **Saint Joseph School District** assumed there would be costs associated with reporting requirements.

Oversight assumes savings generated from restrictions on school personnel compensations would more than offset reporting costs. For fiscal note purposes only, **Oversight** will only reflect an Unknown savings to school districts.

This proposed legislation was sent to the following school districts, none of which responded to a request for fiscal impact: Blue Springs, Branson, Columbia, Fair Grove, Francis Howell, Independence, Jefferson City, Kirksville, Lee's Summit, Mexico, Nixa, Parkway, Raytown, Sedalia, Sikeston, Silex, Special School District of St Louis County, Spickard, Springfield, St Charles, St Joseph, St Louis City, Sullivan.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal modifies provisions relating to elementary and secondary education.

§Sections 168.107 & 168.223 - SCHOOL PERSONNEL COMPENSATION

This proposal places limits on the amount of compensation a board of education may provide to certain school district personnel. A superintendent, assistant superintendent, administrator, or central office personnel may not receive a total compensation package, as described in the proposal, that exceeds the amount of the district's total average salary for tenured teachers by two and one-half times. In addition, the average administrator salary must not exceed twice the amount of the district's average salary for tenured teachers. Any district that violates these limitations will have an amount equal to one percent of school funding provided through the foundation formula withheld.

§168.124 & 168.221- REDUCTION IN FORCE

Current law allows the board of education of a school district to reduce the number of teachers in a school district under certain circumstances. This proposal requires a school board, when utilizing reduction in force, to reduce administrative costs by a percent equal to the percent by

FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

which the amount of funds spent on teacher compensation was reduced.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
