FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency or on school districts.

Officials from the **University of Missouri System** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.

Officials from the **University of Central Missouri** assume no additional costs related to this proposal. The cost of the computer hardware and instructional software should already be in the budget for a virtual school.

Officials from the **Mexico School District** stated the fiscal impact on their district cannot be determined at this time.

Officials from the **Special School District of St Louis County (SSD)** stated it is difficult to estimate the impact of this proposed legislation. There is no way to estimate how many of the 21,230 students with IEPs would transfer to virtual schools outside St. Louis County. There would also be some expense savings due to the transfer of students, but the savings would depend on whether the district cut or reduced any staff as a result of the transfer.

In response to a similar proposal from last year (SB 329 - FN 1620-02), the following responded:

Officials from the **St Louis Public School District** assumed the proposed legislation would result in a fiscal impact of \$250,000 in salaries and benefits for one full time administrator and one full time assistant to manage additional students in the program, along with funds needed to purchase supplies and equipment.

Officials from the **Blue Springs School District** stated this proposal would cost their district approximately \$6,000 for every student who would enroll in their district to participate in their virtual education programs.

Oversight assumes the proposal is permissive to receiving schools in that it states "School districts or charter schools may enroll any virtual nonresident student." However, a cost can be assessed against a residence district if a school district or charter school elects to provide such virtual education to non-resident students. **Oversight** assumes an (Unknown) cost to school districts.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal allows students to enroll in a school district other than their school district of residence or a charter school for the purpose of attending virtual courses or programs.

The receiving school must admit the student based on the time of application until full capacity is reached. Once enrolled, the student may remain in the program until he or she completes the grade levels offered or withdraws. For school funding purposes, the student will be counted in the district of his or her residence, which must pay the receiving school 72.5% of the previous year's average current expenditure per average daily attendance, provided that the total amount paid by any district shall not exceed the total amount of state aid due to a district under the foundation formula.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
