Bill Summary: This proposal prohibits any contract between an health insurer and a dentist or optometrist from requiring a mandatory fee schedule established by the insurer if the services are not covered in the plan.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Transportation, Department of Conservation and Missouri Highway Patrol** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (MCHCP)** assume this proposal does not fiscally impact their agency. However, MCHCP members could pay additional out-of-pocket expenses because providers could charge the full fee for non-covered services rather than the discounted fee.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - MoHealthNet Division (MHC)** assume under the MHD Managed Care Program and Medicaid in general, services cannot be reimbursed beyond the Medicaid covered services unless they are services provided “in lieu of” other more costly services. It is assumed the dental and optical services that could be non-covered services would be stand alone services and not replacement services for another similar service. Therefore, MHD does not believe these services could be reimbursed by the health plans or paid through a capitation rate by MHD. There would be no fiscal impact to the MHD Managed Care program for this requirement.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

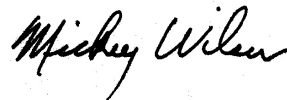
FISCAL DESCRIPTION
