FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, **Office of the State Treasurer** and the **Department of Corrections** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator (CTS)** state the proposed legislation would establish the MODEX fund and deposit one-half of the charges collected by traffic violations bureaus into the MODEX fund to support operational costs.

It is assumed most counties will establish an inmate security fund and that the traffic violations bureau is the Fine Collection Center. Based on FY 2011 data, there were approximately 144,138 traffic cases on which the \$6.00 surcharge could be applied. CTS anticipates the MODEX revenue from the surcharge would be approximately \$432,414 ($144,138 \times $6/2$) in any given year, with an equal amount going to the counties' inmate security funds.

This proposal would increase Total State Revenues.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, law enforcement officers are allowed to charge for their services rendered in criminal cases and in all contempt or attachment proceedings except for cases disposed of by a traffic violation bureau. This bill removes the exception and allows them to also charge for cases in a traffic violation bureau. However, those cases disposed of by a traffic violation bureau must be distributed so that one-half of the charges collected are deposited into the newly-created MODEX Fund for the operational support and expansion costs of the MODEX system and one-half of the charges collected are deposited into the inmate security fund of the county or municipal political subdivision where the citation originated. If the county or municipal political subdivision has not established an inmate security fund, the funds must be deposited in the MODEX Fund.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
