#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the Department of Agriculture, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Higher Education, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Social Services, Linn State Technical College, Metropolitan Community College, Missouri State University, Missouri Veterans Commission, Missouri Western State University, Office of Administration, Office of State Courts Administrator, Parkway School District, Special School District and the University of Central Missouri assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** assume all but one of the facilities operated by DMH currently use safety needles/syringes for most of their injections---especially for intramuscular injections which are frequently given to patients who are combative or have difficulty standing still during the procedure. There are also a number of occasions where "unguarded" needles may be used. These occasions usually involve the small, shorter needles that are used for TB skin testing, insulin injections and flu vaccinations; and involve cooperative subjects. Some facilities also perform their own blood draws, and in those cases, the needles are "unguarded".

If passed, this bill would increase the costs incurred by the Department operated facilities. It would vary by volume and type of patients, and by the amount of current "unguarded" needle/syringe use that would be converted. Generally speaking, a guarded needle/syringe costs two (2) times more than an unguarded needle/syringe. An estimated cost to the DMH would be less than \$25,000 per year.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** defer to local school districts for impact.

Officials at the **Department of Corrections** assume the employee health and safety section in DOC has to purchase about 10,000 syringes per year to perform TB tests. These cost a total of \$1,000 and syringes with safety devices are estimated to cost six times more. Fiscal impact to DOC would be \$5,000 per year.

Officials at the **Reynolds County Health Center** and **Tri-County Health Department** assume unknown increased costs from this proposal.

#### ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials at the **Miller County Health Department** assume the cost of retracting needle syringes are significantly higher than non retractable needle syringes and would add excessive costs that are unable to be passed on to patients.

Officials at the **Northwest Missouri State University** assume an increase of \$1,200 per year for the new needles.

Officials at the **Harrison County Health Department** assume increased costs of \$2,000 to \$3,000 per year.

Officials at the following schools: Blue Springs Public Schools, Branson Public Schools, Columbia Public Schools, Fair Grove Schools, Francis Howell Public Schools, Independence Public Schools, Jefferson City Public Schools, Kansas City Public School Board, Kirksville Public Schools, Lee Summit Public Schools, Mexico Public Schools, Mexico Public Schools, Nixa Public Schools, Raytown School District, Sedalia School District, Sikeston Public Schools, Silex Public Schools, St Joseph School District, St Louis Public Schools, St. Charles Public Schools, and Sullivan Public Schools did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
