1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 90, Page 4, Section 115.007, Line 3, by
2 inserting after all of said Section and Line the following:

4 "115.121. 1. The general election day shall be the first Tuesday after the first Monday in
5 November of even-numbered years.

6 2. The primary election day shall be the [first] third Tuesday after the first Monday in
7 [August] June of even-numbered years.

8 3. The election day for the election of political subdivision and special district officers shall
9 be the first Tuesday after the first Monday in April each year; and shall be known as the general
10 municipal election day.

11 4. In addition to the primary election day provided for in subsection 2 of this section, for the
12 year 2003, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August, 2003, also shall be a primary election
13 day for the purpose of permitting school districts and other political subdivisions of Missouri to incur
14 debt in accordance with the provisions of article VI, section 26(a) through 26(g) of the Missouri
15 Constitution, with the approval of four-sevenths of the eligible voters of such school district or other
16 political subdivision voting thereon, to provide funds for the acquisition, construction, equipping,
17 improving, restoration, and furnishing of facilities to replace, repair, reconstruct, reequip, restore,
18 and refurnish facilities damaged, destroyed, or lost due to severe weather, including, without
19 limitation, windstorms, hail storms, flooding, tornadic winds, rainstorms and the like which occurred
20 during the month of April or May, 2003.

21 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1 of section 115.125, the officer or agency
22 calling an election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of August, 2003, shall notify the
23 election authorities responsible for conducting the election not later than 5:00 p.m. on the sixth
24 Tuesday prior to the election. For purposes of any such election, all references in section 115.125 to
25 the tenth Tuesday prior to such election shall be deemed to refer to the sixth Tuesday prior to such
26 election.

27 6. In addition to the general election day provided for in subsection 1 of this section, for the
28 year 2009 the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November shall be a general election day for
29 the purpose of permitting school districts to incur debt in accordance with the provisions of article
30 VI, section 26(a) through 26(g) of the Missouri Constitution, with the approval of four-sevenths of
31 the eligible voters of such school district, to provide funds for school districts to acquire, construct,
32 equip, improve, restore, and furnish public school facilities in accordance with the provisions of
33 Section 54F of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which provides for qualified school
34 construction bonds and the provisions of Section 54AA of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
35 amended, which provides for build America bonds, as well as in accordance with the provisions of
36 Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which provides for traditional
37 government bonds."; and

Further amend said bill, Section 115.300, Page 8, Line 8, by inserting after all of said Section and Line the following:

"115.341. For the nomination of candidates to be elected at the next general election, a primary election shall be held on the [first] third Tuesday after the first Monday in [August] June of even-numbered years.

115.349. 1. Except as otherwise provided in sections 115.361 to 115.383 or sections 115.755 to 115.785, no candidate's name shall be printed on any official primary ballot unless the candidate has filed a written declaration of candidacy in the office of the appropriate election official by 5:00 p.m. on the [last] first Tuesday in [March] February immediately preceding the primary election.

2. No declaration of candidacy for nomination in a primary election shall be accepted for filing prior to 8:00 a.m. on the [last] second Tuesday in [February] January immediately preceding the primary election.

3. Each declaration of candidacy for nomination in a primary election shall state the candidate's full name, residence address, office for which such candidate proposes to be a candidate, the party ticket on which he or she wishes to be a candidate and that if nominated and elected he or she will qualify. The declaration shall be in substantially the following form: I,, a resident and registered voter of the county of and the state of Missouri, residing at, do announce myself a candidate for the office of on the party ticket, to be voted for at the primary election to be held on the day of, and I further declare that if nominated and elected to such office I will qualify.

If the declaration is to be filed by certified mail pursuant to the provisions of subsection 2 of section 115.355, it shall be subscribed and sworn to by the candidate before a notary public or other officer authorized by law to administer oaths."; and

Further amend said bill, Section 115.601, Page 15, Line 48, by inserting after all of said Section and Line the following:

"Section B. The repeal and reenactment of sections 115.121, 115.341, and 115.349 of section A of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2016."; and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
