1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill Nos. 1235 & 1214, Page 1, Lines 2-3 in the 2 Title, by deleting the words "weight limitations for"; and 3 4 Further amend said bill, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after all of said section and line the 5 following: 6 7 "301.010. As used in this chapter and sections 304.010 to 304.040, 304.120 to 304.260, and 8 sections 307.010 to 307.175, the following terms mean: 9 (1) "All-terrain vehicle", any motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively 10 for off-highway use which is fifty inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of one 11 thousand five hundred pounds or less, traveling on three, four or more nonhighway tires, with a seat 12 designed to be straddled by the operator, or with a seat designed to carry more than one person, and 13 handlebars for steering control: 14 (2) "Automobile transporter", any vehicle combination designed and used 15 specifically for the transport of assembled motor vehicles; 16 (3) "Axle load", the total load transmitted to the road by all wheels whose centers are included between two parallel transverse vertical planes forty inches apart, extending across the full 17 18 width of the vehicle; 19 (4) "Boat transporter", any vehicle combination designed and used specifically to 20 transport assembled boats and boat hulls: (5) "Body shop", a business that repairs physical damage on motor vehicles that are 21 22 not owned by the shop or its officers or employees by mending, straightening, replacing body parts, 23 or painting; 24 (6) "Bus", a motor vehicle primarily for the transportation of a driver and eight or 25 more passengers but not including shuttle buses; 26 (7) "Commercial motor vehicle", a motor vehicle designed or regularly used for 27 carrying freight and merchandise, or more than eight passengers but not including vanpools or shuttle buses; 28 29 (8) "Cotton trailer", a trailer designed and used exclusively for transporting cotton at 30 speeds less than forty miles per hour from field to field or from field to market and return; (9) "Dealer", any person, firm, corporation, association, agent or subagent engaged in 31 32 the sale or exchange of new, used or reconstructed motor vehicles or trailers; 33 (10) "Director" or "director of revenue", the director of the department of revenue; 34 (11) "Driveaway operation": (a) The movement of a motor vehicle or trailer by any person or motor carrier other 35 than a dealer over any public highway, under its own power singly, or in a fixed combination of two 36 Action Taken Date

or more vehicles, for the purpose of delivery for sale or for delivery either before or after sale; 1 2 (b) The movement of any vehicle or vehicles, not owned by the transporter, 3 constituting the commodity being transported, by a person engaged in the business of furnishing 4 drivers and operators for the purpose of transporting vehicles in transit from one place to another by 5 the driveaway or towaway methods; or 6 (c) The movement of a motor vehicle by any person who is lawfully engaged in the 7 business of transporting or delivering vehicles that are not the person's own and vehicles of a type 8 otherwise required to be registered, by the driveaway or towaway methods, from a point of 9 manufacture, assembly or distribution or from the owner of the vehicles to a dealer or sales agent of 10 a manufacturer or to any consignee designated by the shipper or consignor; (12) "Dromedary", a box, deck, or plate mounted behind the cab and forward of the 11 12 fifth wheel on the frame of the power unit of a truck tractor-semitrailer combination. A truck tractor 13 equipped with a dromedary may carry part of a load when operating independently or in a 14 combination with a semitrailer; 15 (13) "Farm tractor", a tractor used exclusively for agricultural purposes; 16 (14) "Fleet", any group of ten or more motor vehicles owned by the same owner; 17 (15) "Fleet vehicle", a motor vehicle which is included as part of a fleet; (16) "Fullmount", a vehicle mounted completely on the frame of either the first or 18 19 last vehicle in a saddlemount combination; 20 (17) "Gross weight", the weight of vehicle and/or vehicle combination without load, 21 plus the weight of any load thereon; (18) "Hail-damaged vehicle", any vehicle, the body of which has become dented as 22 23 the result of the impact of hail; 24 (19) "Highway", any public thoroughfare for vehicles, including state roads, county 25 roads and public streets, avenues, boulevards, parkways or alleys in any municipality; (20) "Improved highway", a highway which has been paved with gravel, macadam, 26 27 concrete, brick or asphalt, or surfaced in such a manner that it shall have a hard, smooth surface; 28 (21) "Intersecting highway", any highway which joins another, whether or not it 29 crosses the same: 30 (22) "Junk vehicle", a vehicle which is incapable of operation or use upon the 31 highways and has no resale value except as a source of parts or scrap, and shall not be titled or 32 registered; 33 (23) "Kit vehicle", a motor vehicle assembled by a person other than a generally 34 recognized manufacturer of motor vehicles by the use of a glider kit or replica purchased from an 35 authorized manufacturer and accompanied by a manufacturer's statement of origin; 36 (24) "Land improvement contractors' commercial motor vehicle", any not-for-hire 37 commercial motor vehicle the operation of which is confined to: 38 (a) An area that extends not more than a radius of one hundred miles from its home base of operations when transporting its owner's machinery, equipment, or auxiliary supplies to or 39 40 from projects involving soil and water conservation, or to and from equipment dealers' maintenance 41 facilities for maintenance purposes; or 42 (b) An area that extends not more than a radius of fifty miles from its home base of 43 operations when transporting its owner's machinery, equipment, or auxiliary supplies to or from 44 projects not involving soil and water conservation. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to 45 prevent any motor vehicle from being registered as a commercial motor vehicle or local commercial 46 motor vehicle; 47 (25) "Local commercial motor vehicle", a commercial motor vehicle whose 48 operations are confined solely to a municipality and that area extending not more than fifty miles

therefrom, or a commercial motor vehicle whose property-carrying operations are confined solely to 1

2 the transportation of property owned by any person who is the owner or operator of such vehicle to

3 or from a farm owned by such person or under the person's control by virtue of a landlord and tenant 4 lease; provided that any such property transported to any such farm is for use in the operation of such 5 farm:

6 (26) "Local log truck", a commercial motor vehicle which is registered pursuant to 7 this chapter to operate as a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state, used exclusively in 8 this state, used to transport any form or type of harvested forest products, operated solely at a 9 forested site and in an area extending not more than a [one] two hundred-mile radius from such site, 10 carries a load with dimensions not in excess of twenty-five cubic yards per two axles with dual 11 wheels, and when operated on the national system of interstate and defense highways described in 12 Title 23, Section 103(e) of the United States Code, such vehicle shall not exceed the weight limits of 13 section 304.180, does not have more than four axles, and does not pull a trailer which has more than 14 two axles. Harvesting equipment which is used specifically for cutting, felling, trimming, 15 delimbing, debarking, chipping, skidding, loading, unloading, and stacking may be transported on a 16 local log truck. A local log truck may not exceed the limits required by law, however, if the truck 17 does exceed such limits as determined by the inspecting officer, then notwithstanding any other 18 provisions of law to the contrary, such truck shall be subject to the weight limits required by such 19 sections as licensed for eighty thousand pounds;

20 (27) "Local log truck tractor", a commercial motor vehicle which is registered under 21 this chapter to operate as a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state, used exclusively in 22 this state, used to transport any form or type of harvested forest products, operated solely at a 23 forested site and in an area extending not more than a [one] two hundred-mile radius from such site, 24 operates with a weight not exceeding twenty-two thousand four hundred pounds on one axle or with 25 a weight not exceeding forty-four thousand eight hundred pounds on any tandem axle, and when 26 operated on the national system of interstate and defense highways described in Title 23, Section 27 103(e) of the United States Code, such vehicle does not exceed the weight limits contained in section 28 304.180, and does not have more than three axles and does not pull a trailer which has more than two 29 axles. Violations of axle weight limitations shall be subject to the load limit penalty as described for in sections 304.180 to 304.220: 30

31 (28) "Local transit bus", a bus whose operations are confined wholly within a 32 municipal corporation, or wholly within a municipal corporation and a commercial zone, as defined 33 in section 390.020, adjacent thereto, forming a part of a public transportation system within such 34 municipal corporation and such municipal corporation and adjacent commercial zone;

35 (29) "Log truck", a vehicle which is not a local log truck or local log truck tractor and 36 is used exclusively to transport harvested forest products to and from forested sites which is 37 registered pursuant to this chapter to operate as a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state 38 for the transportation of harvested forest products;

39 (30) "Major component parts", the rear clip, cowl, frame, body, cab, front-end 40 assembly, and front clip, as those terms are defined by the director of revenue pursuant to rules and 41 regulations or by illustrations;

(31) "Manufacturer", any person, firm, corporation or association engaged in the 42 43 business of manufacturing or assembling motor vehicles, trailers or vessels for sale;

44 (32) "Motor change vehicle", a vehicle manufactured prior to August, 1957, which 45 receives a new, rebuilt or used engine, and which used the number stamped on the original engine as 46 the vehicle identification number;

47 (33) "Motor vehicle", any self-propelled vehicle not operated exclusively upon 48 tracks, except farm tractors;

1 (34) "Motor vehicle primarily for business use", any vehicle other than a recreational 2 motor vehicle, motorcycle, motortricycle, or any commercial motor vehicle licensed for over twelve 3 thousand pounds: 4 (a) Offered for hire or lease; or 5 (b) The owner of which also owns ten or more such motor vehicles; 6 (35) "Motorcycle", a motor vehicle operated on two wheels; 7 (36) "Motorized bicycle", any two-wheeled or three-wheeled device having an 8 automatic transmission and a motor with a cylinder capacity of not more than fifty cubic centimeters. 9 which produces less than three gross brake horsepower, and is capable of propelling the device at a 10 maximum speed of not more than thirty miles per hour on level ground; 11 (37) "Motortricycle", a motor vehicle operated on three wheels, including a 12 motorcycle while operated with any conveyance, temporary or otherwise, requiring the use of a third 13 wheel. A motortricycle shall not be included in the definition of all-terrain vehicle; 14 (38) "Municipality", any city, town or village, whether incorporated or not; 15 (39) "Nonresident", a resident of a state or country other than the state of Missouri; 16 (40) "Non-USA-std motor vehicle", a motor vehicle not originally manufactured in 17 compliance with United States emissions or safety standards; 18 (41) "Operator", any person who operates or drives a motor vehicle; 19 (42) "Owner", any person, firm, corporation or association, who holds the legal title 20 to a vehicle or in the event a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease 21 thereof with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement and 22 with an immediate right of possession vested in the conditional vendee or lessee, or in the event a 23 mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession, then such conditional vendee or lessee or mortgagor 24 shall be deemed the owner for the purpose of this law; 25 (43) "Public garage", a place of business where motor vehicles are housed, stored, 26 repaired, reconstructed or repainted for persons other than the owners or operators of such place of 27 business: 28 (44) "Rebuilder", a business that repairs or rebuilds motor vehicles owned by the 29 rebuilder, but does not include certificated common or contract carriers of persons or property; 30 (45) "Reconstructed motor vehicle", a vehicle that is altered from its original 31 construction by the addition or substitution of two or more new or used major component parts, 32 excluding motor vehicles made from all new parts, and new multistage manufactured vehicles; 33 (46) "Recreational motor vehicle", any motor vehicle designed, constructed or 34 substantially modified so that it may be used and is used for the purposes of temporary housing 35 quarters, including therein sleeping and eating facilities which are either permanently attached to the motor vehicle or attached to a unit which is securely attached to the motor vehicle. Nothing herein 36 37 shall prevent any motor vehicle from being registered as a commercial motor vehicle if the motor 38 vehicle could otherwise be so registered; (47) "Recreational off-highway vehicle", any motorized vehicle manufactured and 39 40 used exclusively for off-highway use which is sixty-four inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of two thousand pounds or less, traveling on four or more nonhighway tires, with a 41 42 nonstraddle seat, and steering wheel, which may have access to ATV trails; 43 (48) "Rollback or car carrier", any vehicle specifically designed to transport wrecked, 44 disabled or otherwise inoperable vehicles, when the transportation is directly connected to a wrecker 45 or towing service; (49) "Saddlemount combination", a combination of vehicles in which a truck or truck 46 47 tractor tows one or more trucks or truck tractors, each connected by a saddle to the frame or fifth wheel of the vehicle in front of it. The "saddle" is a mechanism that connects the front axle of the 48

towed vehicle to the frame or fifth wheel of the vehicle in front and functions like a fifth wheel 1 2 kingpin connection. When two vehicles are towed in this manner the combination is called a "double 3 saddlemount combination". When three vehicles are towed in this manner, the combination is called 4 a "triple saddlemount combination": 5 (50) "Salvage dealer and dismantler", a business that dismantles used motor vehicles 6 for the sale of the parts thereof, and buys and sells used motor vehicle parts and accessories; 7 (51) "Salvage vehicle", a motor vehicle, semitrailer, or house trailer which: 8 (a) Was damaged during a year that is no more than six years after the manufacturer's 9 model year designation for such vehicle to the extent that the total cost of repairs to rebuild or 10 reconstruct the vehicle to its condition immediately before it was damaged for legal operation on the 11 roads or highways exceeds eighty percent of the fair market value of the vehicle immediately 12 preceding the time it was damaged; 13 (b) By reason of condition or circumstance, has been declared salvage, either by its 14 owner, or by a person, firm, corporation, or other legal entity exercising the right of security interest 15 in it: 16 (c) Has been declared salvage by an insurance company as a result of settlement of a 17 claim; 18 (d) Ownership of which is evidenced by a salvage title; or (e) Is abandoned property which is titled pursuant to section 304.155 or section 19 20 304.157 and designated with the words "salvage/abandoned property". The total cost of repairs to 21 rebuild or reconstruct the vehicle shall not include the cost of repairing, replacing, or reinstalling 22 inflatable safety restraints, tires, sound systems, or damage as a result of hail, or any sales tax on 23 parts or materials to rebuild or reconstruct the vehicle. For purposes of this definition, "fair market 24 value" means the retail value of a motor vehicle as: 25 a. Set forth in a current edition of any nationally recognized compilation of retail 26 values, including automated databases, or from publications commonly used by the automotive and 27 insurance industries to establish the values of motor vehicles; 28 b. Determined pursuant to a market survey of comparable vehicles with regard to 29 condition and equipment; and 30 c. Determined by an insurance company using any other procedure recognized by the 31 insurance industry, including market surveys, that is applied by the company in a uniform manner; 32 (52) "School bus", any motor vehicle used solely to transport students to or from 33 school or to transport students to or from any place for educational purposes; 34 (53) "Scrap processor", a business that, through the use of fixed or mobile 35 equipment, flattens, crushes, or otherwise accepts motor vehicles and vehicle parts for processing or transportation to a shredder or scrap metal operator for recycling; 36 (54) "Shuttle bus", a motor vehicle used or maintained by any person, firm, or 37 38 corporation as an incidental service to transport patrons or customers of the regular business of such 39 person, firm, or corporation to and from the place of business of the person, firm, or corporation 40 providing the service at no fee or charge. Shuttle buses shall not be registered as buses or as 41 commercial motor vehicles; (55) "Special mobile equipment", every self-propelled vehicle not designed or used 42 43 primarily for the transportation of persons or property and incidentally operated or moved over the 44 highways, including farm equipment, implements of husbandry, road construction or maintenance 45 machinery, ditch-digging apparatus, stone crushers, air compressors, power shovels, cranes, graders, 46 rollers, well-drillers and wood-sawing equipment used for hire, asphalt spreaders, bituminous 47 mixers, bucket loaders, ditchers, leveling graders, finished machines, motor graders, road rollers, 48 scarifiers, earth-moving carryalls, scrapers, drag lines, concrete pump trucks, rock-drilling and

1 earth-moving equipment. This enumeration shall be deemed partial and shall not operate to exclude 2 other such vehicles which are within the general terms of this section; 3 (56) "Specially constructed motor vehicle", a motor vehicle which shall not have 4 been originally constructed under a distinctive name, make, model or type by a manufacturer of 5 motor vehicles. The term specially constructed motor vehicle includes kit vehicles; 6 (57) "Stinger-steered combination", a truck tractor-semitrailer wherein the fifth 7 wheel is located on a drop frame located behind and below the rearmost axle of the power unit; 8 (58) "Tandem axle", a group of two or more axles, arranged one behind another, the 9 distance between the extremes of which is more than forty inches and not more than ninety-six 10 inches apart; 11 (59) "Tractor", "truck tractor" or "truck-tractor", a self-propelled motor vehicle designed for drawing other vehicles, but not for the carriage of any load when operating 12 13 independently. When attached to a semitrailer, it supports a part of the weight thereof; 14 (60) "Trailer", any vehicle without motive power designed for carrying property or 15 passengers on its own structure and for being drawn by a self-propelled vehicle, except those running 16 exclusively on tracks, including a semitrailer or vehicle of the trailer type so designed and used in 17 conjunction with a self-propelled vehicle that a considerable part of its own weight rests upon and is 18 carried by the towing vehicle. The term "trailer" shall not include cotton trailers as defined in 19 subdivision (8) of this section and shall not include manufactured homes as defined in section 20 700.010; 21 (61) "Truck", a motor vehicle designed, used, or maintained for the transportation of 22 property; 23 (62) "Truck-tractor semitrailer-semitrailer", a combination vehicle in which the two 24 trailing units are connected with a B-train assembly which is a rigid frame extension attached to the 25 rear frame of a first semitrailer which allows for a fifth-wheel connection point for the second 26 semitrailer and has one less articulation point than the conventional A-dolly connected truck-tractor 27 semitrailer-trailer combination; 28 (63) "Truck-trailer boat transporter combination", a boat transporter combination 29 consisting of a straight truck towing a trailer using typically a ball and socket connection with the 30 trailer axle located substantially at the trailer center of gravity rather than the rear of the trailer but so 31 as to maintain a downward force on the trailer tongue; 32 (64) "Used parts dealer", a business that buys and sells used motor vehicle parts or 33 accessories, but not including a business that sells only new, remanufactured or rebuilt parts. 34 "Business" does not include isolated sales at a swap meet of less than three days; 35 (65) "Utility vehicle", any motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for 36 off-highway use which is sixty-three inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of one 37 thousand eight hundred fifty pounds or less, traveling on four or six wheels, to be used primarily for 38 landscaping, lawn care, or maintenance purposes; 39 (66) "Vanpool", any van or other motor vehicle used or maintained by any person, 40 group, firm, corporation, association, city, county or state agency, or any member thereof, for the transportation of not less than eight nor more than forty-eight employees, per motor vehicle, to and 41 from their place of employment; however, a vanpool shall not be included in the definition of the 42 43 term bus or commercial motor vehicle as defined by subdivisions (6) and (7) of this section, nor shall 44 a vanpool driver be deemed a chauffeur as that term is defined by section 303.020; nor shall use of a 45 vanpool vehicle for ride-sharing arrangements, recreational, personal, or maintenance uses constitute an unlicensed use of the motor vehicle, unless used for monetary profit other than for use in a 46 47 ride-sharing arrangement; 48 (67) "Vehicle", any mechanical device on wheels, designed primarily for use, or

1 used, on highways, except motorized bicycles, vehicles propelled or drawn by horses or human 2 power, or vehicles used exclusively on fixed rails or tracks, or cotton trailers or motorized 3 wheelchairs operated by handicapped persons; 4 (68) "Wrecker" or "tow truck", any emergency commercial vehicle equipped, 5 designed and used to assist or render aid and transport or tow disabled or wrecked vehicles from a 6 highway, road, street or highway rights-of-way to a point of storage or repair, including towing a 7 replacement vehicle to replace a disabled or wrecked vehicle; 8 (69) "Wrecker or towing service", the act of transporting, towing or recovering with a 9 wrecker, tow truck, rollback or car carrier any vehicle not owned by the operator of the wrecker, tow 10 truck, rollback or car carrier for which the operator directly or indirectly receives compensation or 11 other personal gain."; and 12 13 Further amend said bill, Page 8, Section 304.180, Line123, by inserting after the word "Highways." 14 the following: 15 16 "As used in this section, "agricultural product" means an agricultural, horticultural, 17 viticultural, or vegetable product, growing of grapes that will be processed into wine, bees, honey, 18 fish or other aquacultural product, planting seed, livestock, a livestock product, a forestry product, 19 poultry or a poultry product, either in its natural or processed state, that has been produced, 20 processed, or otherwise had value added to it in this state."; and 21 22 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references 23 accordingly. 24 25
