AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 1189, Page 1, in the Title, Lines 2 and 3, by deleting the words "graduation requirements" and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
"elementary and secondary education"; and
Further amend said bill and page, Section A, Line 2, by inserting immediately after all of said line the following:
"161.960. 1. There is hereby established in the department of elementary and secondary
education a "Council for Community Education".
2. The council shall have a membership of eleven persons, appointed by the governor.
Membership may include, but not be limited to, representatives of the following groups:
(1) Civic organizations;
(2) Community-based organizations;
(3) Community education organizations;
(4) Local government;
(5) Local school district administrators;
(6) Parent organizations;
(7) Post-secondary education;
(8) School boards; and
(9) Teachers.
3. The commissioner of education or the commissioner's designee shall convene the first
meeting of the council for the purpose of establishing the bylaws of the council and electing officers
to include a chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary. The council shall not meet more than four
times annually. Members may be reimbursed for expenses but shall not receive a per diem
allowance.
4. The council shall:
(1) Conduct feasibility studies on the establishment of community education programs
within the state;
(2) Advise the commissioner of education and the department of education on issues relating to the establishment of community education programs;

1 (3) Make recommendations for a state plan for community education which sets forth the 2 goals and objectives of a community schools program and establishes a system of priorities for 3 targeting available resources on the areas with the greatest need within a school district; and 4 (4) Make recommendations for the funding of local community education programs. 5 5. For purposes of this section, "community school", means a school that makes its facilities 6 available for citizen use, coordinates activities of local citizens in identifying program needs and 7 establishing priorities, identifies and utilizes available program resources, and assists in the initiation 8 of programs to improve the cultural, social, recreational, and educational opportunities available in a 9 community. "Community education program", means a program in which a public building, 10 including a public elementary or secondary school, is used as a community center operated by a 11 school board in cooperation with other groups in the community, community organizations, and local governmental agencies to provide educational, recreational, cultural, health care, and other related 12 13 community services in accordance with the needs, interests, and concerns of the community."; and 14 15 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references 16 accordingly. 17
