The portion of the fine distributed to the local school district shall not diminish 8 the portion of the fine that is distributed to local municipalities and shall not be included in such 9 district's "local effort" figure, as such term is defined in section 163.011. 10 2. For purposes of this section, the following terms shall mean: 11 (1) "Automated speed enforcement system", a device with one or more motor vehicle 12 sensors, including but not limited to, photographic devices, radar devices, laser devices, or other 13 electrical or mechanical devices designed to record the speed of a motor vehicle and to obtain a clear 14 photograph or other recorded image of the motor vehicle and the motor vehicle's license plate which 15 automatically produces one or more photographs, one or more microphotographs, a videotape, or 16 other recorded image of a motor vehicle at the time it is used or operated in violation of the posted 17 speed limit; 18 (2) "Automated traffic enforcement system", a camera, optical device, electronic system or 19 other surveillance system designed to record and produce photographic images, video, or other 20 digital data of a motor vehicle, a motor vehicle's operator, or both, violating a traffic control signal, 21 speed restriction, or other traffic law, ordinance or regulation. Automated traffic enforcement 22 systems shall also include automated speed enforcement systems; 23 (3) "Surveillance system", a system designed to determine the ownership of a motor vehicle 24 or the identity of a motor vehicle's occupants on the highways of the state or its political subdivisions 25 through the use of a camera, other imaging device or any other device, including, but not limited to, 26 a transponder, cellular telephone, global positioning satellite, or radio frequency identification 27 device, that by itself, or in conjunction with other devices or information, can be used to determine 28 the ownership of a motor vehicle or the identity of a motor vehicle's occupants."; and 29 30 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references 31 accordingly.
