	department of elementary and secondary education the "A+ Schools Program" to be administered by the commissioner of education.
	The program shall consist of [grant awards] <u>scholarships</u> made to graduates of public <u>and private</u> secondary schools [that
(	demonstrate a commitment to ensure that] <u>who</u> : (1) [All students be graduated from school;
	(2) All students] Complete a selection of high school studies that is challenging and for which there are identified
	learning expectations; and
	[(3) All students] <u>(2)</u> Proceed from high school graduation to a college or postsecondary vocational or technical school or high-wage job with work place skill development opportunities.
	2. <u>Pursuant to the A+ program</u> , the state board of education
	shall promulgate rules and regulations [for the approval of grants made under the program to schools that:
	(1) Establish measurable districtwide performance standards for the goals of the program outlined in subsection 1 of this
	section; and (2)] <u>that</u> specify the knowledge, skills and competencies,
	in measurable terms, that students must demonstrate to successfully complete any individual course offered by [the] <u>a</u>

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1 school[,] and any course of studies which will qualify a student 2 for graduation from [the] such school[;] and does not include any 3 general track course, that upon completion, counts toward a high 4 school diploma, and

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[(3) Do not offer a general track of courses that, upon 6 completion, can lead to a high school diploma; and

7 Require] further specify rigorous coursework with (4) 8 standards of competency in basic academic subjects for students 9 pursuing vocational and technical education [as prescribed by 10 rule and regulation of the state board of education; and

11 Have a partnership plan developed in cooperation and (5) 12 with the advice of local business persons, labor leaders, 13 parents, and representatives of college and postsecondary 14 vocational and technical school representatives, with the plan 15 then approved by the local board of education. The plan shall 16 specify a mechanism to receive information on an annual basis 17 from those who developed the plan in addition to senior citizens, 18 community leaders, and teachers to update the plan in order to 19 best meet the goals of the program as provided in subsection 1 of 20 this section. Further, the plan shall detail the procedures used 21 in the school to identify students that may drop out of school 22 and the intervention services to be used to meet the needs of 23 such students. The plan shall outline counseling and mentoring 24 services provided to students who will enter the work force upon 25 graduation from high school, address apprenticeship and intern 26 programs, and shall contain procedures for the recruitment of 27 volunteers from the community of the school to serve in schools 28 receiving program grants.

29 A school district may participate in the program 3. 30 irrespective of its accreditation classification by the state 31 board of education, provided it meets all other requirements.

32 By rule and regulation, the state board of education may 4. 33 determine a local school district variable fund match requirement in order for a school or schools in the district to receive a 34 grant under the program. However, no school in any district 35 36 shall receive a grant under the program unless the district 37 designates a salaried employee to serve as the program

1 coordinator, with the district assuming a minimum of one-half the 2 cost of the salary and other benefits provided to the 3 coordinator. Further, no school in any district shall receive a 4 grant under the program unless the district makes available 5 facilities and services for adult literacy training as specified 6 by rule of the state board of education.

7 For any school that meets the requirements for the 5. 8 approval of the grants authorized by this section and specified 9 in subsection 2 of this section for three successive school years, by August first following the third such school year, the 10 11 commissioner of education shall present a plan to the 12 superintendent of the school district in which such school is 13 located for the waiver of rules and regulations to promote 14 flexibility in the operations of the school and to enhance and 15 encourage efficiency in the delivery of instructional services in 16 the school. The provisions of other law to the contrary 17 notwithstanding, the plan presented to the superintendent shall 18 provide a summary waiver, with no conditions, for the pupil 19 testing requirements pursuant to section 160.257 in the school. 20 Further, the provisions of other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the plan shall detail a means for the waiver of 21 22 requirements otherwise imposed on the school related to the 23 authority of the state board of education to classify school 24 districts pursuant to subdivision (9) of section 161.092 and such 25 other rules and regulations as determined by the commissioner of 26 education, except such waivers shall be confined to the school 27 and not other schools in the school district unless such other 28 schools meet the requirements of this subsection. However, any 29 waiver provided to any school as outlined in this subsection 30 shall be void on June thirtieth of any school year in which the 31 school fails to meet the requirements for the approval of the 32 grants authorized by this section as specified in subsection 2 of 33 this section.

The commissioner of education shall, by rule and 2 regulation of the state board of education and with the advice of 3 the coordinating board for higher education, establish a 4 procedure for the [reimbursement] payment of the cost of tuition, 5 books and fees to any public community college or vocational or technical school or within the limits established in subsection 6 7 [9] 11 of this section for any two-year private vocational or 8 technical school for any student:

Who has attended a public or private high school in the 9 (1) 10 state for at least three years immediately prior to graduation 11 [that meets the requirements of subsection 2 of this section], 12 except that students who are active duty military dependents, and 13 students who are dependants of retired military who relocate to 14 Missouri within one year of the date of the parent's retirement 15 from active duty, who, in the school year immediately preceding 16 graduation, meet all other requirements of this subsection and 17 are attending a school that meets the requirements of [subsection 18 2 of] this section shall be exempt from the three-year attendance 19 requirement of this subdivision; and

1 [8.] <u>10.</u> The commissioner of education shall develop a 2 procedure for evaluating the effectiveness of the <u>scholarship</u> 3 program described in this section. Such evaluation shall be 4 conducted annually with the results of the evaluation provided to 5 the governor, speaker of the house, and president pro tempore of 6 the senate.

7 [9.] <u>11.</u> For a two-year private vocational or technical 8 school to obtain reimbursements under subsection [7] <u>3</u> of this 9 section, the following requirements shall be satisfied:

10 (1) Such two-year private vocational or technical school 11 shall be a member of the North Central Association and be 12 accredited by the Higher Learning Commission as of July 1, 2008, 13 and maintain such accreditation;

14 (2) Such two-year private vocational or technical school 15 shall be designated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization under 16 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

17 (3) No two-year private vocational or technical school 18 shall receive tuition reimbursements in excess of the tuition 19 rate charged by a public community college for course work 20 offered by the private vocational or technical school within the 21 service area of such college; and

(4) The reimbursements provided to any two-year private vocational or technical school shall not violate the provisions of Article IX, Section 8, or Article I, Section 7, of the Missouri Constitution or the first amendment of the United States Constitution."; and
