5. Nothing in this section shall be construed or
interpreted as prohibiting a person from making or taking part in
a telephone call, by means of a hand-held electronic wireless
communications device, while operating a noncommercial motor
vehicle upon the highways of this state.

6. As used in this section, "electronic message" means a self-contained piece of digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted between hand-held electronic wireless communication devices. "Electronic message" includes, but is not limited to, electronic mail, a text message, an instant message, or a command or request to access an internet site.

17 7. As used in this section, "hand-held electronic wireless 18 communications device" includes any hand-held cellular phone, 19 palm pilot, blackberry, or other mobile electronic device used to 20 communicate verbally or by text or electronic messaging, but 21 shall not apply to any device that is permanently embedded into 22 the architecture and design of the motor vehicle.

8. As used in this section, "making or taking part in a
telephone call" means listening to or engaging in verbal
communication through a hand-held electronic wireless
communication device.

27 As used in this section, "send, read, or write a text 9. message or electronic message" means using a hand-held electronic 28 29 wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with 30 any person by using an electronic message. Sending, reading, or 31 writing a text message or electronic message does not include 32 reading, selecting, or entering a phone number or name into a 33 hand-held electronic wireless communications device for the 34 purpose of making a telephone call.

35 10. A violation of this section shall be deemed an 36 infraction and shall be deemed a moving violation for purposes of 37 point assessment under section 302.302.

1 The state preempts the field of regulating the use of 11. 2 hand-held electronic wireless communications devices in motor vehicles, and the provisions of this section shall supercede any 3 4 local laws, ordinances, orders, rules, or regulations enacted by 5 a county, municipality, or other political subdivision to 6 regulate the use of hand-held electronic wireless communication 7 devices by the operator of a motor vehicle.

12. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:

9 (1)The operator of a vehicle that is lawfully parked or 10 stopped;

11 Any of the following while in the performance of their (2) 12 official duties: a law enforcement officer; a member of a fire 13 department; or the operator of a public or private ambulance;

The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global 14 (3) 15 positioning systems (GPS) or wireless communications devices used 16 to transmit or receive data as part of a digital dispatch system; 17

(4) The use of voice-operated technology;

18 (5) The use of two-way radio transmitters or receivers by a 19 licensee of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur 20 Radio Service."; and
