Any entity or person who knowingly, as defined in section 562.016, violates section 1.235 or 1.326 or otherwise knowingly deprives a citizen of Missouri of the rights or privileges ensured by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution or section 23 of article I of the Missouri Constitution, while acting under the color of any state or federal law, shall be liable to the injured party in an action at law, suit in equity, or other proper proceeding for redress.
- 1. In such actions, the court may award the prevailing party, other than the state of Missouri or any political subdivision of the state, reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 2. Neither sovereign nor official or qualified immunity shall be an affirmative defense in such cases.
- 1.328. Any official, agent, or employee of the United States government who deprives a citizen of Missouri of the rights or privileges ensured by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution or section 23 of article I of the Missouri Constitution by knowingly enforcing or attempting to enforce any of the infringements on the right to keep and bear arms included in section 1.322 is guilty of a class A misdemeanor. Missouri law enforcement officers shall have the

discretionary power to appropriately interpose on behalf of honest citizens, including the power to levy charges or arrest such officials, agents, or employees of the United States government.

1.329. For the purposes of sections 1.320 through 1.329, the term "honest citizen" shall mean a person who is not otherwise precluded under state law from possessing a firearm and shall not be construed to include anyone who is not legally present in the United States or the state of Missouri."; and
