1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Substitute No. 2 for Senate Bill No. 754, Page 1,
2 Section A, Line 4, by inserting after all of said section and line the following:
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4 "174.335. 1. Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year and for each school year thereafter,
5 every public institution of higher education in this state shall require all students who reside in
6 on-campus housing to [sign a written waiver stating that the institution of higher education has
7 provided the student, or if the student is a minor, the student's parents or guardian, with detailed
8 written information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and the availability and
9 effectiveness of] have received the meningococcal vaccine unless a signed statement of medical or
10 religious exemption is on file with the institution's administration. A student shall be exempted from
11 the immunization requirement of this section upon signed certification by a physician licensed under
12 chapter 334, indicating that either the immunization would seriously endanger the student's health or
13 life or the student has documentation of the disease or laboratory evidence of immunity to the
14 disease. A student shall be exempted from the immunization requirement of this section if he or she
15 objects in writing to the institution's administration that immunization violates his or her religious
16 beliefs.

17 2. [Any student who elects to receive the meningococcal vaccine shall not be required to sign
18 a waiver referenced in subsection 1 of this section and shall present a record of said vaccination to
19 the institution of higher education.

20 3.] Each public university or college in this state shall maintain records on the
21 meningococcal vaccination status of every student residing in on-campus housing at the university or
22 college[, including any written waivers executed pursuant to subsection 1 of this section].

23 [4.] 3. Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring any institution of higher
24 education to provide or pay for vaccinations against meningococcal disease.

25 191.761. 1. Beginning July 1, 2015, the department of health and senior services shall
26 provide a courier service to transport collected, donated umbilical cord blood samples to a nonprofit
27 umbilical cord blood bank located in a city not within a county in existence as of the effective date of
28 this section. The collection sites shall only be those facilities designated and trained by the blood
29 bank in the collection and handling of umbilical cord blood specimens.

30 2. The department may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any
31 rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority
32 delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the
33 provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are
34 nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly under chapter 536 to
35 review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
36 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after

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3 Further amend said bill, Page 5, Section 196.990, Line 90, by inserting after all of said section and
4 line the following:

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6 "197.168. Each year between October first and March first and in accordance with the latest
7 recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers for Disease
8 Control and Prevention, each hospital licensed under this chapter shall offer, prior to discharge and
9 with the approval of the attending physician or other practitioner authorized to order vaccinations or
10 as authorized by physician-approved hospital policies or protocols for influenza vaccinations
11 pursuant to state hospital regulations, immunizations against influenza virus to all inpatients
12 sixty-five years of age and older unless contraindicated for such patient and contingent upon the
13 availability of the vaccine."; and

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15 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
16 accordingly.
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
